

Dr. Dunn Speaks on Dangers of a Bad Milk Supply

Rotary Club Brings Dairymen and Surgeon Together for General Good

Taking the "cow by the horns" as it were, the Haileybury Rotary Club at its luncheon last week, brought the local dairymen and the district veterinary surgeon, Dr. J. Dunn, together for a talk on matters in connection with a better milk supply, a subject that has been engaging the attention of the town council and the board of health for the past few months. It had been proposed that a by-law be passed compelling all dairymen to have their herds tested for tuberculosis and later there was some discussion over the system of pasteurization, the question being left in abeyance to enable the board of health to arrive at the best solution.

Dr. Dunn gave a very interesting talk on the dangers that lurk in an impure milk supply, the investigations that have been made towards overcoming the trouble, the value of milk as a food, proper types of dairy cows, etc.

Some of his statements that were particularly interesting were that 25 to 40 per cent of the tuberculosis in children was of the bovine type, that practically all the communicable diseases are traced to the milk supply at some time and that milk is one of the best media for disease producing organisms. The doctor explained the system of pasteurization, which, he said, was not ideal, but only an expedient. It cannot replace sanitation and common cleanliness, he said, and it must be handled as carefully as raw milk. He stressed the absolute necessity of having clean stables and clean houses for the handling of the milk and above all a good clean herd of dairy cows.

"It is a well recognized fact," the doctor said, "that nations where the people have the best teeth and the best bone development are the nations where dairying is the chief industry. An ample amount of milk and other dairy products is absolutely necessary for good health."

Dr. Dunn said that skim milk, which was looked upon as of little value, was more valuable as a food than the cream that is taken off it. Skim milk contains all the nutritive properties of the whole milk, with the exception of the fat.

He passed around several charts which showed the death rate in Ontario from various diseases in which the milk supply was a distributing factor and impressed on the club members the necessity of doing anything in their power to assist the local board of health in their endeavors to improve the food supply. "As a service club, with one of your objects being child welfare, why not begin at home by backing up any movement for the general good," he concluded.

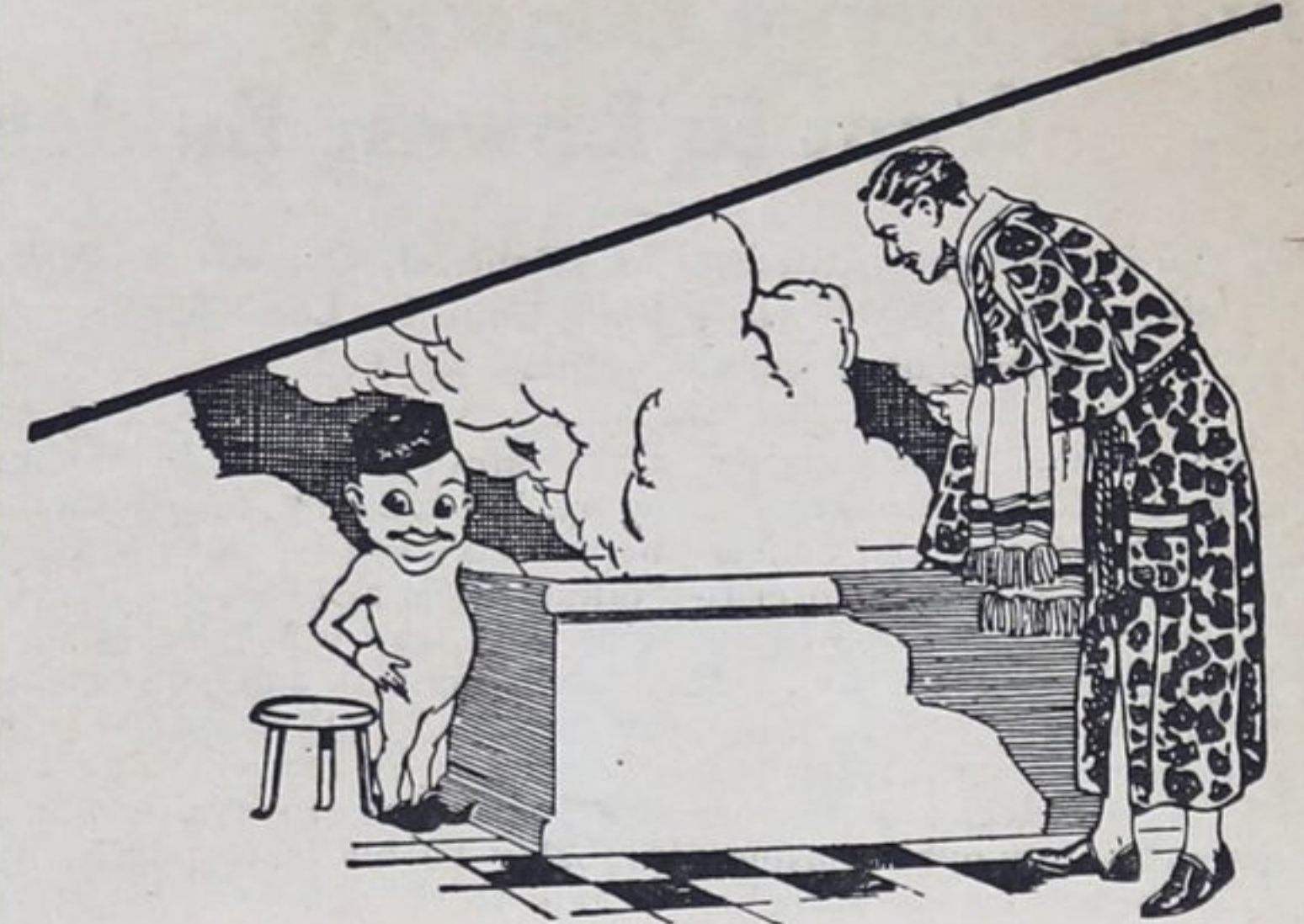
