Former Chief of Police Sam Newton, of Haileybury, has been appointed constable at Iroquois Falls, after serving some time in a similar position at Ansonville.

Four lots on Latchford Street have been transferred to the Public School Board by the town council for the purpose of erecting temporary school buildings.

Jos. Isherwood, local contractor, has been awarded the contract for the new separate school building and work has already commenced on the excavations.

RESIDENTS OF MOSCOW READ CANADIAN NOVEL AND WRITE TO AUTHOR

Leslie McFarlane's novel, "Streets of Shadow," has been read with great interest by the English speaking residents of Moscow, in the Soviet Empire, according to a letter received by Mr. McFarlane last week. The letter was from a lady who had received a copy of the book early in the summer and stated that it had been handed around among the American colony until nearly everyone had read and enjoyed the story, the scene of which is laid in Montreal.

The book, which is the first full length novel by the Haileybury author, has had a very successful sale both in Canada and the United States and negotiations are now under way to bring out a British edition.

Mr. McFarlane last week completed his second novel, "The Murder Tree," and the manuscript has been sent to his publishers. He spent almost a year in writing it and expects that it will come out this fall or winter.
