

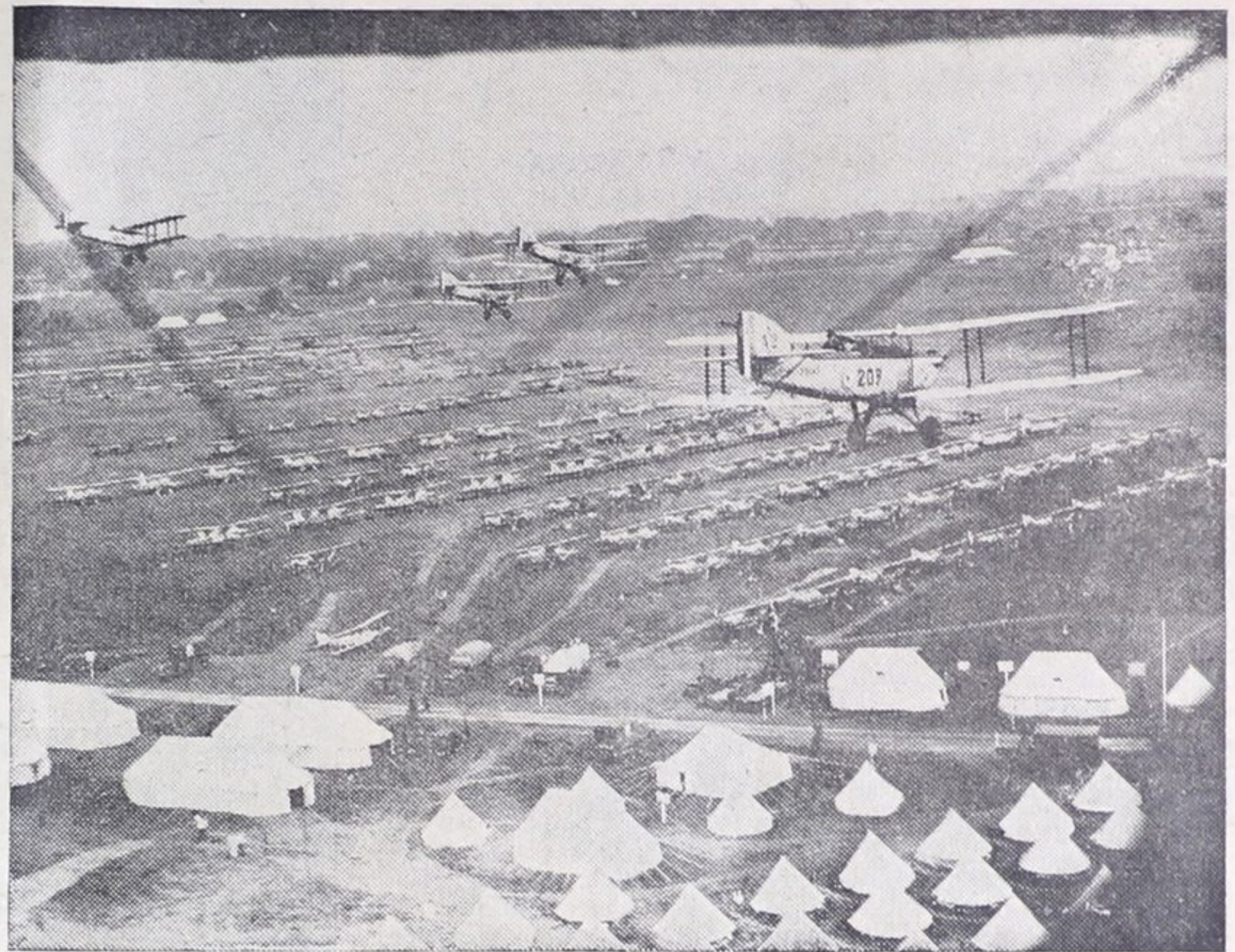

Britain Shows Her Teeth at Air Pageant



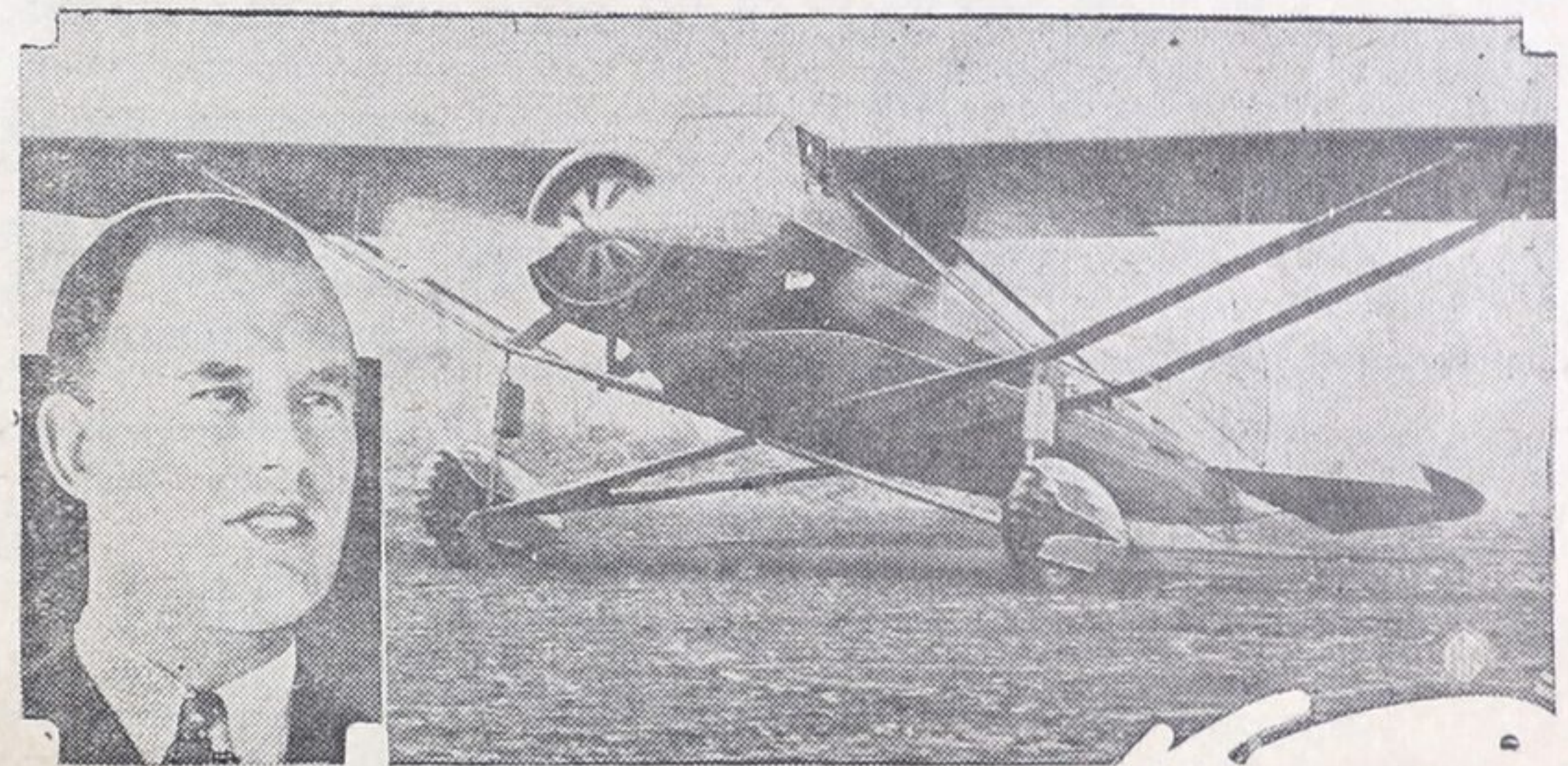

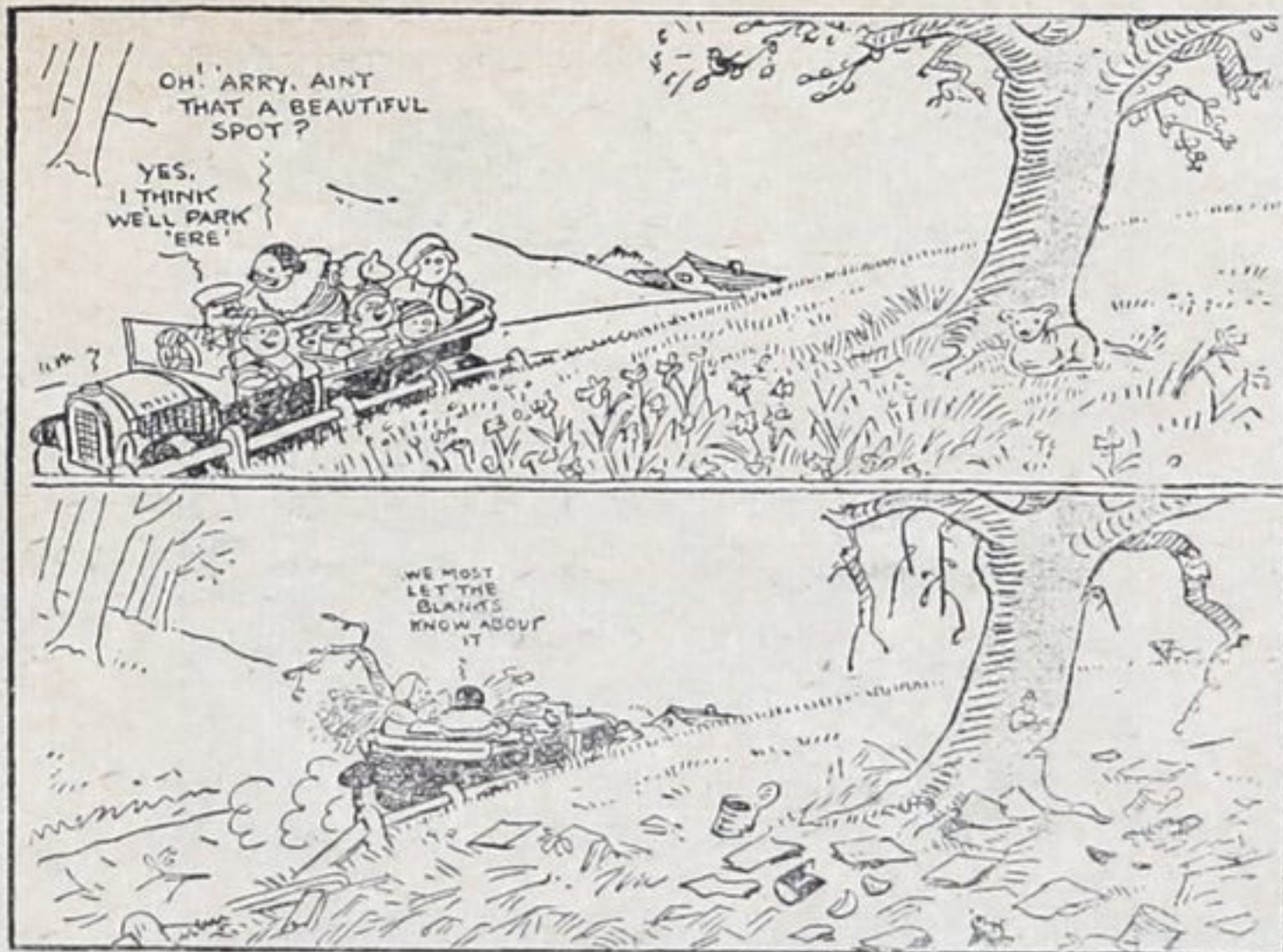
The above photograph was taken from one of the bombing planes after formation practice at Hendon, England, and shows below half of the gigantic fleet of British Air Force machines which were used at the R.A.F. Pageant at Hendon earlier in July.



The committee looking after the British Empire Games, to be staged at Hamilton in August, decided that the medal to be awarded to the victors in the games should be somewhat different from the usual run, and in the championship medal above they have it. The medal is held in a metal frame and is removable. The left-hand illustration is of the medal and stand and the right-hand illustration of the reverse side of the medal. The reproductions are the exact size of the awards, which will be gold, silver and bronze.

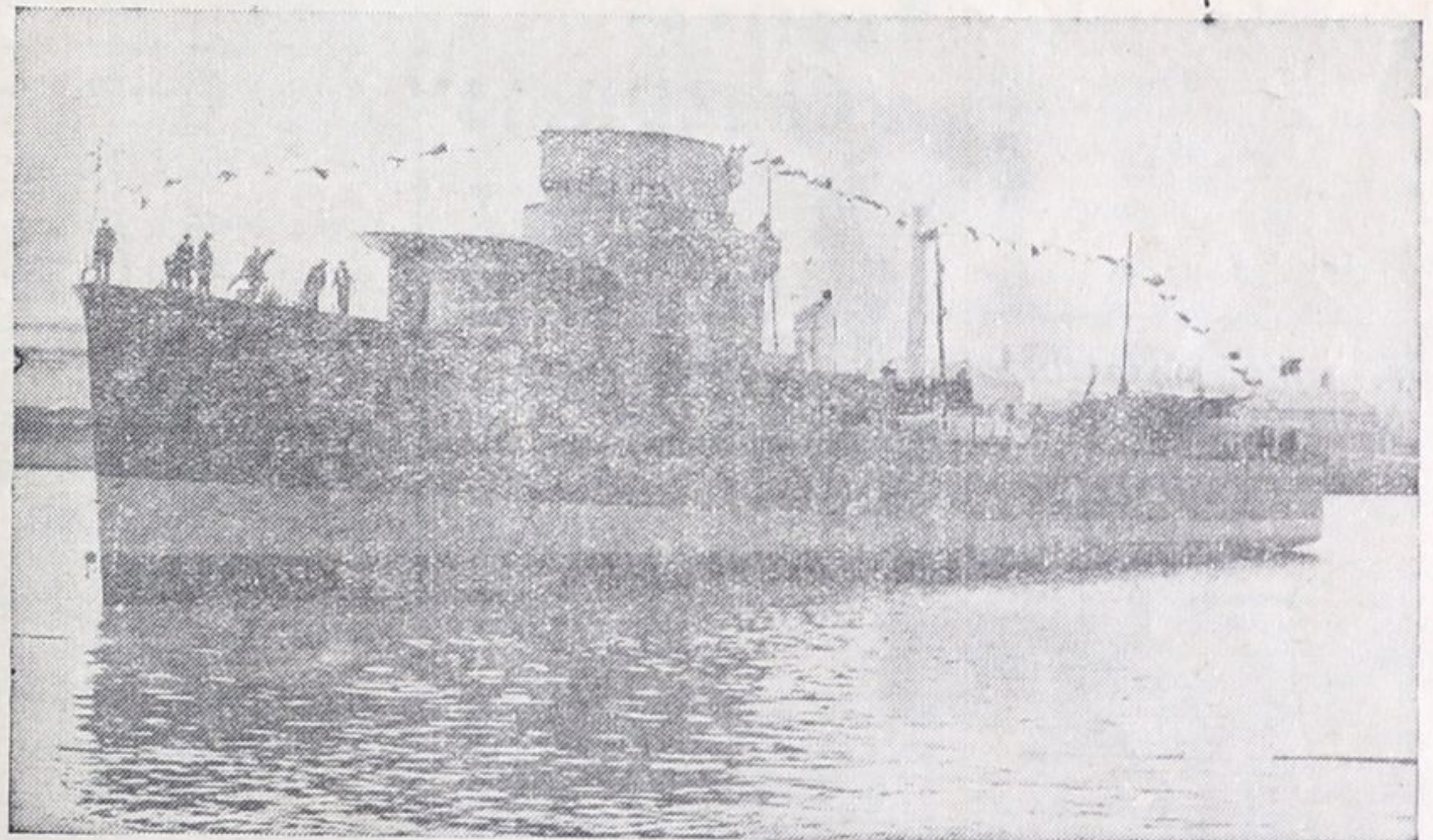

Heir to Throne May Come North of Tweed

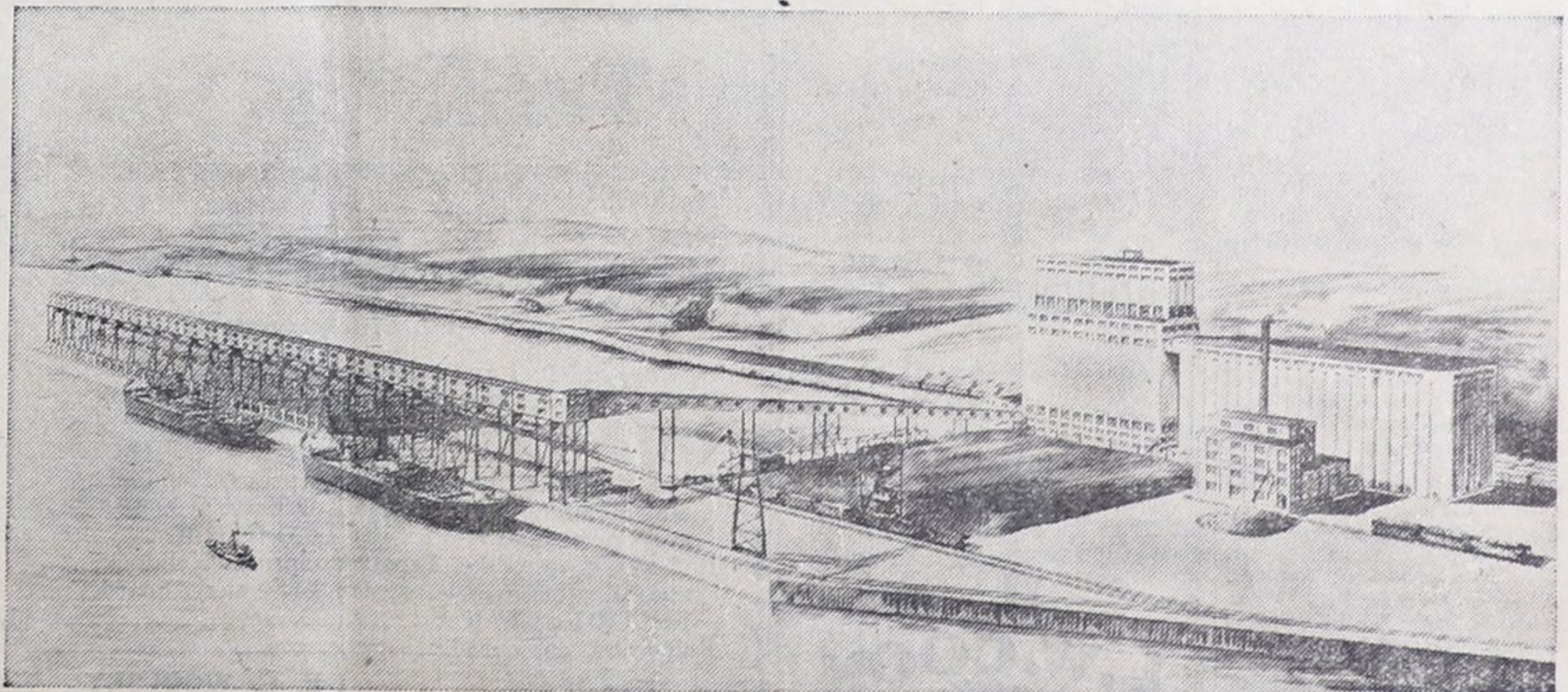
