Mrs. Matthew Floody

Many old friends in Haileybury were grieved to learn this week of the death of Mrs. Matthew Floody, which took place in St. Michael's Hospital, Toronto, on Saturday last, November 15th. She had been ill for some time and two weeks prior to her death had undergone an operation.

The late Mrs. Floody was born in Devonshire, England, 66 years ago and had spent the greater part of her life in Canada. With Mr. Floody, who died four years ago, she had lived in Blyth, Ont., before coming to Haileybury in the early days of the town. For the past few years she had resided at the home of her daughter, Mrs. R. Lloyd Beel, in Toronto. She was a member of the United Church and during her long residence in Haileybury had made many friends and was well liked by all. Besides her daughter, she is survived by one sister, Mrs. Johns, of Exeter, Ont., and two brothers, Edwin L. and Roger Crocker, Toronto.

The funeral was held on Monday, November 17th, interment being in Mount Pleasant Cemetery, Toronto.
