It is very comprehensive and covers all points which are likely to crop up in the future in regard to the milk and cream supply.

When the by-law was being. passed the question of the price of milk in Haileybury came up and some of the councillors gave wa it as their opinion that these prices were higher than in some communities. It was stated, however, that the measure was intended wholly for the securing

As the new by-law has been discussed at various intervals for some time and its provisions made known to the milk dealers, the main requirements have already been complied with. The larger dairies have all either had their herds tested or installed the pasteurization system and Dr. No. Arnold, M.O.H., has reported that the stables, milk houses and other premises are being kept in good shape.


