Wheat King's Latest Photo



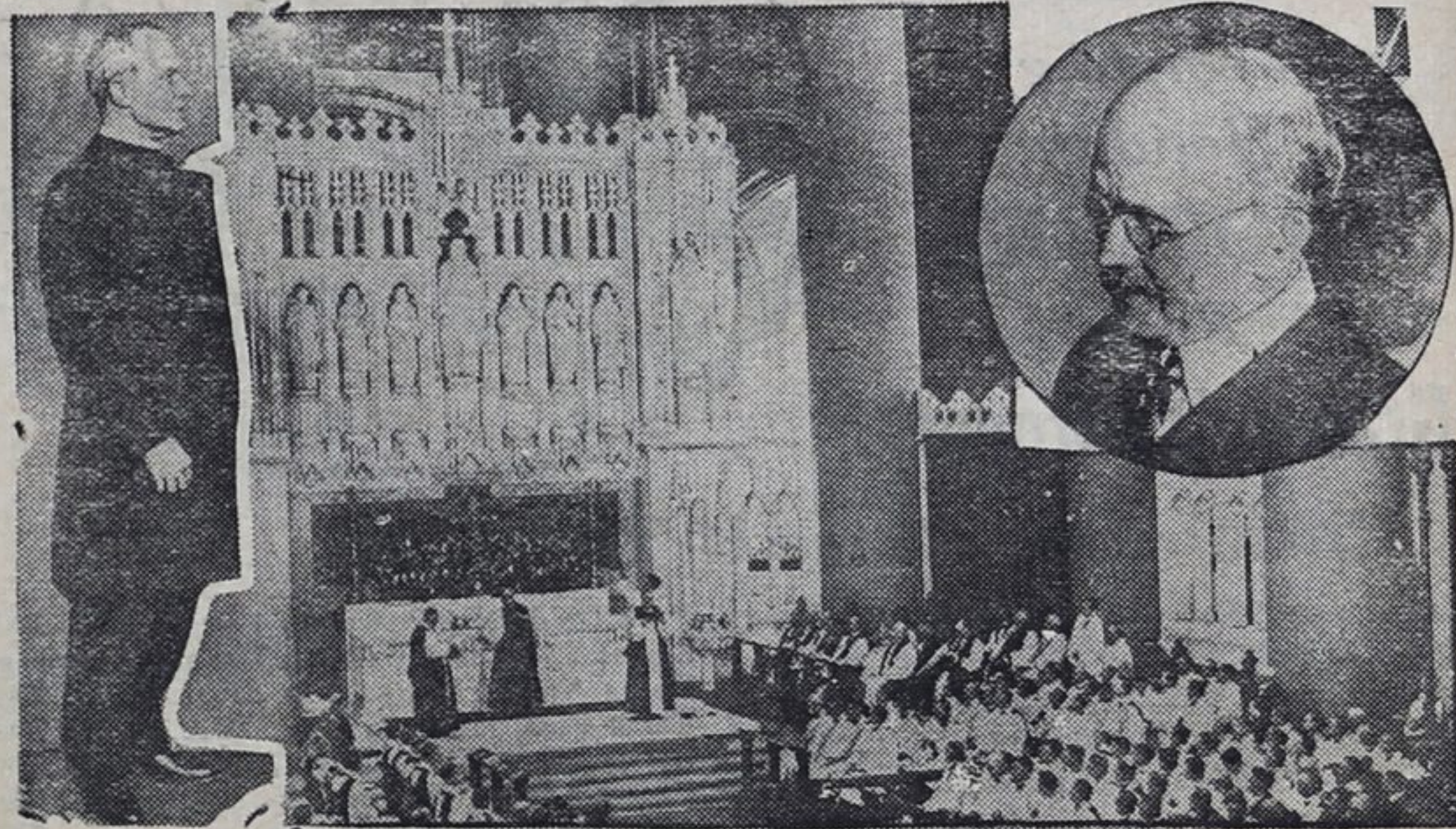

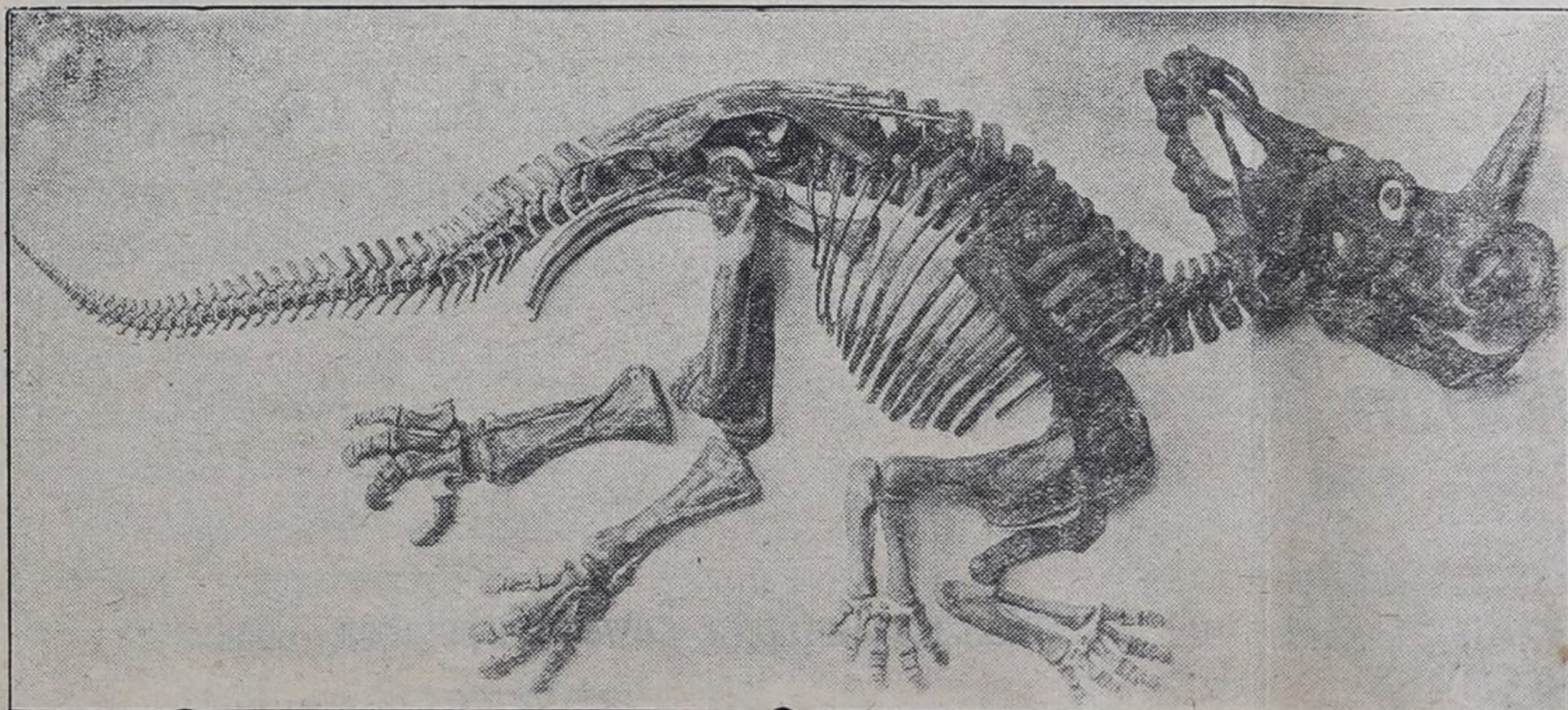
