

### New Post Office At Liskeard Is Election Issue

Results Show Residents Favor Corner Site; Arthur Amm Heads the Polls

New Liskeard fought out its election contest on Monday almost entirely on the question of the site of the proposed new post office, with the result that those who favored the site at the corner of Whitewood Avenue and Paget Street, which the council of 1930 agreed to exchange with the government for the Armstrong Street site, were greatly in the majority. The six candidates favoring the corner site were elected, while the four who entered the fight on that issue alone and held to the Armstrong Street location were literally snowed under.

Arthur Amm, formerly of Haileybury and a member of last year's council, headed the poll and it is said that the contest was the hottest in years. Mayor Homer Sutcliffe, who was elected by acclamation, is also in favor of the corner site, so that the new council is a unit in this regard and apparently have the backing of a great majority of the ratepayers.

As an indication of the sweeping verdict on the main question are the figures polled by R. R. Woods, who headed the defeated "slate" and whose record of 292 put him one ballot ahead of half the number polled by W. H. Walter, who ran sixth. W. A. Taylor, an ex-mayor, came next to Mr. Woods, and A. J. Wagner and J. W. McKinlay, both members of the 1930 council, were the others who went down to defeat.

Favored by good weather, a record vote was got out and the candidates and their friends were kept busy rushing voters to the polls up to the closing minute, when one woman, who had twice refused male canvassers, yielded to the blandishments of another woman and temporarily left her duties of preparing supper to exercise her franchise. 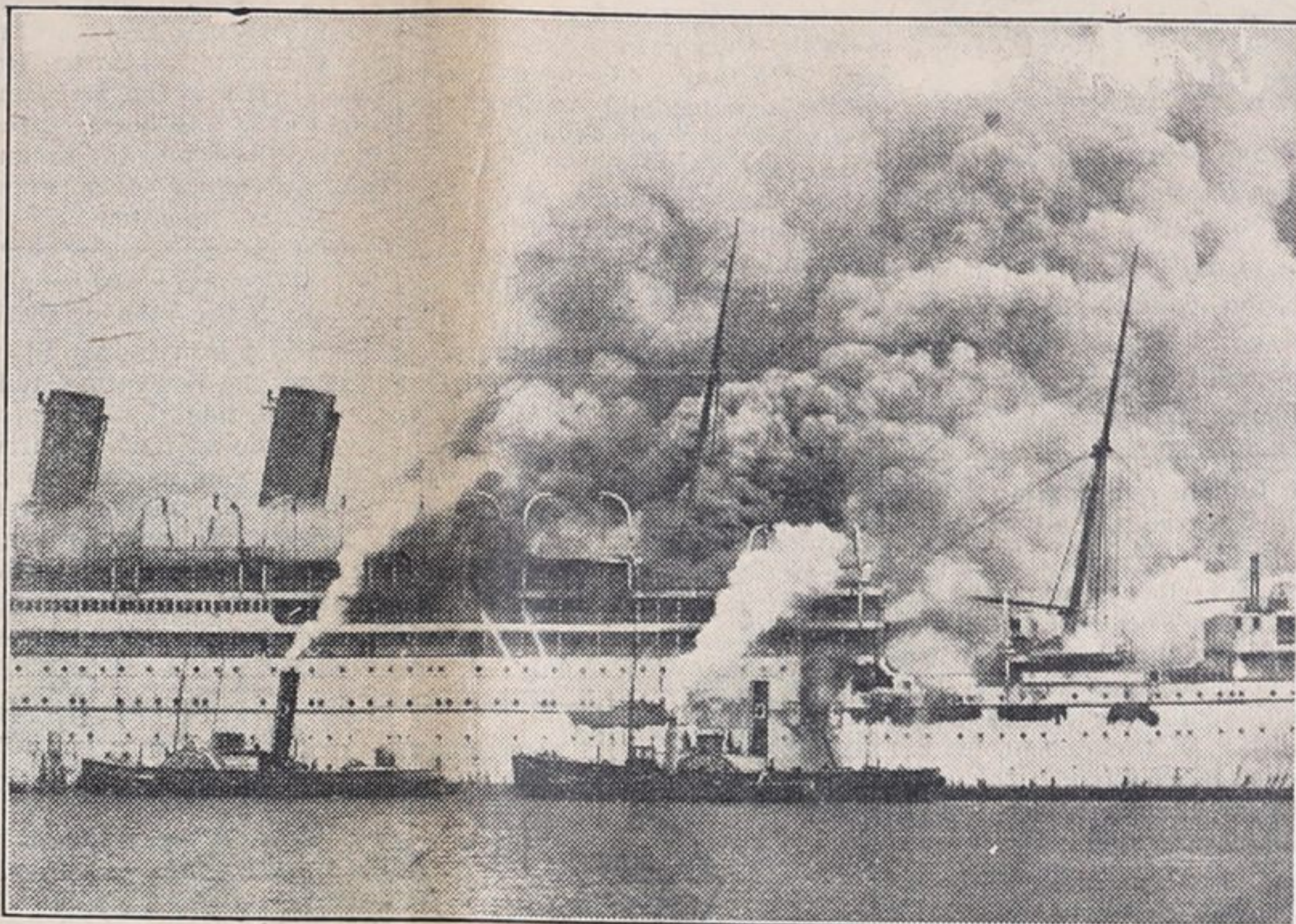

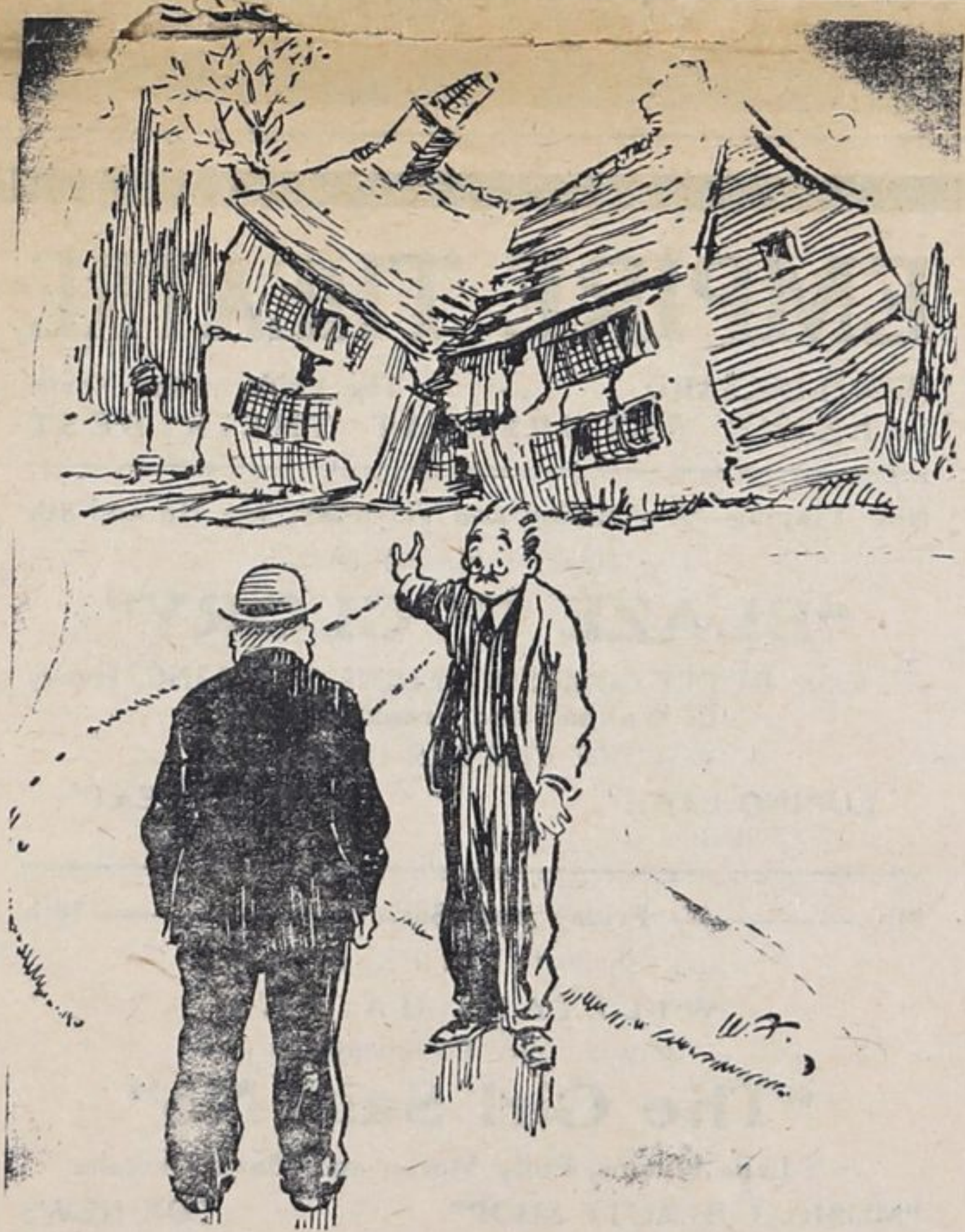
