

Grover Shields Competition Is Now Under Way

Twenty Rinks Entered in Four Groups; First Games Were Played Last Friday

The curling season at the local rink was officially opened on Friday last, when the first games in the Grover Shield Competition, big event of the winter, were played. There are 20 rinks entered, playing in four groups of five, and the addition of a long list of spare players makes the membership now well over one hundred.

Following the usual custom, three games are being played nightly, leaving one sheet of ice free for odd games among the members, and there is good sport being enjoyed every night.

Cobalt Seniors Victors; Juniors Win and Lose

Miners Defeat Liskeard Last Night; Juniors Beat Farmers But Lose to Haileybury

Senior N.O.H.A. hockey was revived in Cobalt last night after a lapse of some years, and the results were quite satisfactory to the Silver City fans, for their representatives in the Central Group handed the New Liskeard team a three to one beating, to inaugurate the season's schedule.

The victors deserved to win for they had the better of a rather listless opening session, held their own in the second period, after New Liskeard had shown marked improvement, and went on to outlast their guests in the closing stages. There was no scoring in the opening twenty minutes and Cobalt led, 1-0 at the second intermission.

The game was featured by a short chapter of accidents, although, fortunately, none of the mishaps proved serious. Herron who started in goal for the visitors, had his forehead cut open by a skate during a scrimmage near the net in the first period, and had to retire. His place, after considerable interval, was taken by Hansman, the Juniors' goalie. In the third period, Jack Fitzmaurice, Cobalt defence man went off for a time with a tricky knee, and he had no sooner returned than Nolan, his colleague, sustained a leg injury and left for the balance of the play.

Cobalt had only two subs to start with, and one man only was available for relief work in the last period. Despite this handicap, the home lot were the fresher team in the final stages and they rushed in two goals in short order to sew up the contest, after Liskeard had tied up the score. Fitzmaurice had two goals for Cobalt, the first and third, both scored on solo rushes through the Liskeard team. Ferguson got the other after losing the puck and then recovering it.

Johnston, center man for the losers, got their lone tally when he snipped in a nice shot from straight in front.

On the night's play, Cobalt were the better balanced team. Their forward line was superior to the front rank of the losers, displaying attempts at combination that were largely lacking with New Liskeard. The visitors depended strongly on individual sallies, Hennessy and Johnston being prominent in this respect, but they were away off in their finishing and proved decidedly weak when near the Cobalt nets. Ferguson was the best forward on show, with Johnston running him close. Five minor penalties were handed out.

Haileybury, 6; Cobalt Jrs. 5

Ten minutes overtime were required to decide the opening battle between Cobalt and Haileybury Juniors on Tuesday evening at the local arena, and the spectators, small in number for such an important game, went home, thrilled with the rousing finish.

There was some discussion after the tilt was finished, it being claimed that the timers' gong sounded before the winning goal was notched, but as the referee did not hear it, and as his bell is the signal to end play, the goal counted. It was a tough one for the Cobalters to lose, as some of the players, having heard the gong, did not make any effort to stop McGinley, the local puck carrier, and he went right in to beat McCarthy.

Cobalt had the better of the opening period's play, getting four counters, two very soft, and leading at the end of the frame by 4-2. Morin opened the scoring after three minutes play, and Haileybury on a Dempster, McGinley rush tied it up a couple of minutes later, and then forged to

the front in half a minute on a goal by Caldwell. Carbonneau tied it up, and Fortin put Cobalt one up, and just before the gong B. Gleason added another for the Silver Town crew.

Haileybury were outplayed in the early part of the second canto although Cobalt could not tally on Lemay, who had replaced Hendry in the nets. Finally after twelve minutes of play, the homesters on a Dempster, O'Grady rush, put one past McCarthy, making it 4-3. Carbonneau gave Cobalt back their two-goal lead three minutes later, on a pass from Moore, and the period ended 5-3 for the Miners.

Haileybury started the third spasm with a rush and a three-man combination effort netted them a goal in the first minute of play. O'Grady getting the goal after a nice passing bout with McGinley and Dempster. They then sent four men up and kept the visitors backed up behind the blue line for most of the balance of the period, and with only a minute to play Mart O'Grady

got through and counted the tying counter.

The first five minutes of overtime were unproductive, although the locals missed several good chances, after beating the defence, and Lemay made a marvellous save to keep Cobalt off the score sheet. After changing ends play was resumed faster than ever, and substitutions were made at every sound of the referee's bell, Haileybury going so far as to remove the defence pair and substitute two of the alternate forwards. It was just before the gong that McGinley broke away, leaving the Cobalt forwards far in the ruck, and bore down on the defence duo, who made no effort to stop his progress. McCarthy, in the net, tried to get in front of Kenny's drive, but was unsuccessful, and Haileybury boys reeled to the dressing room with a victory.

Accidents laid out Dempster twice, also B. Gleason and Fortin, but all were back in action before the end of the game. Only two penalties were imposed, the

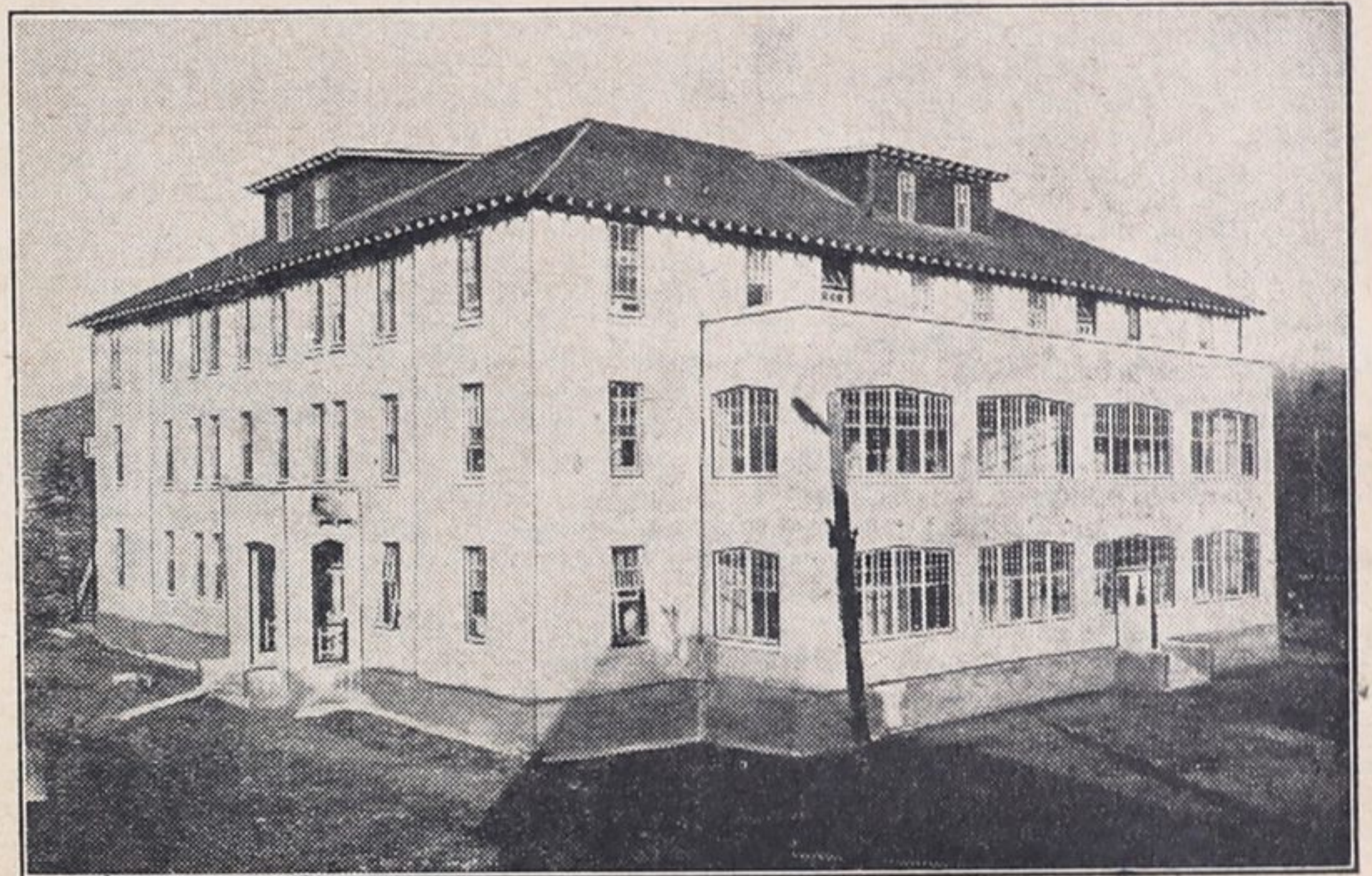

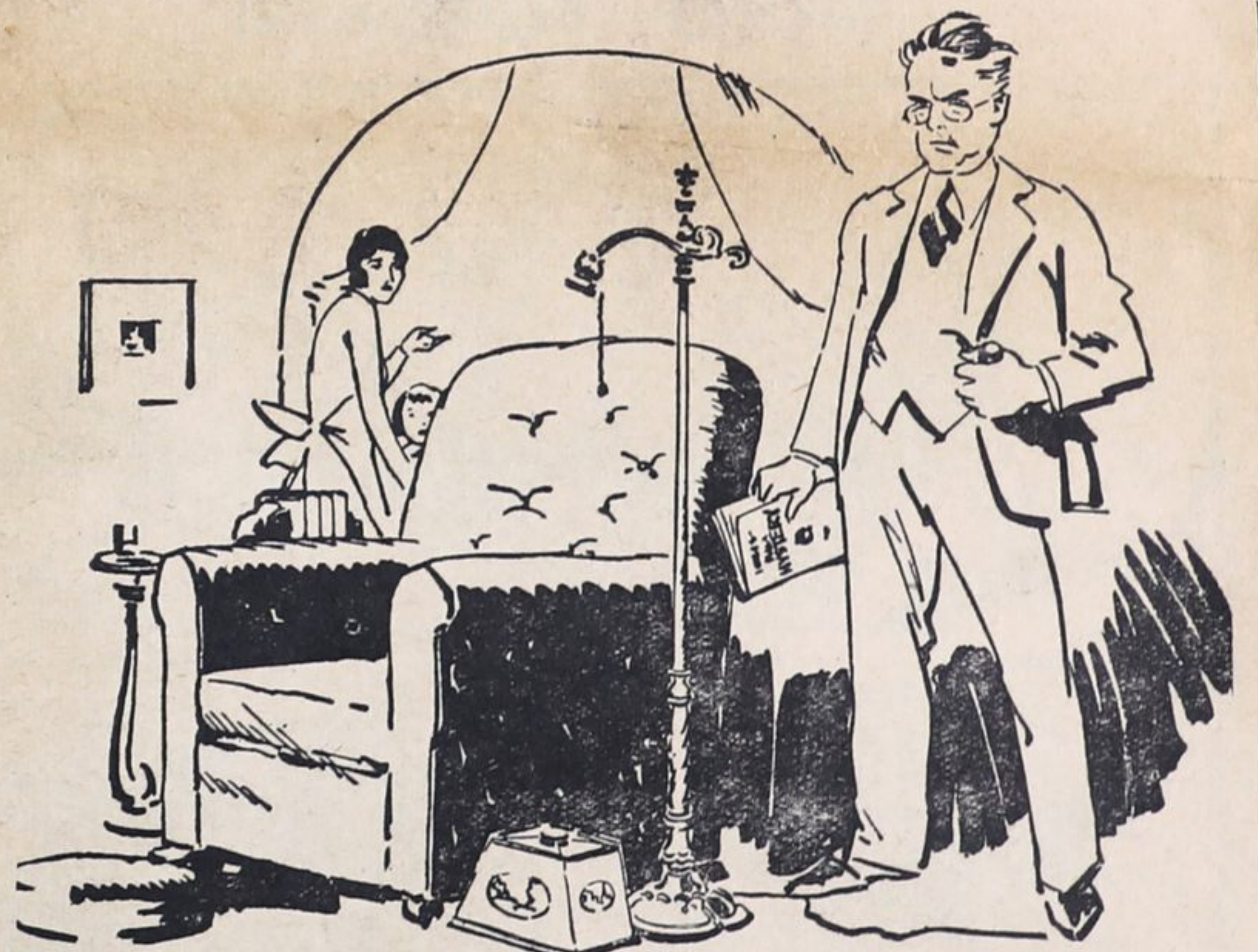
