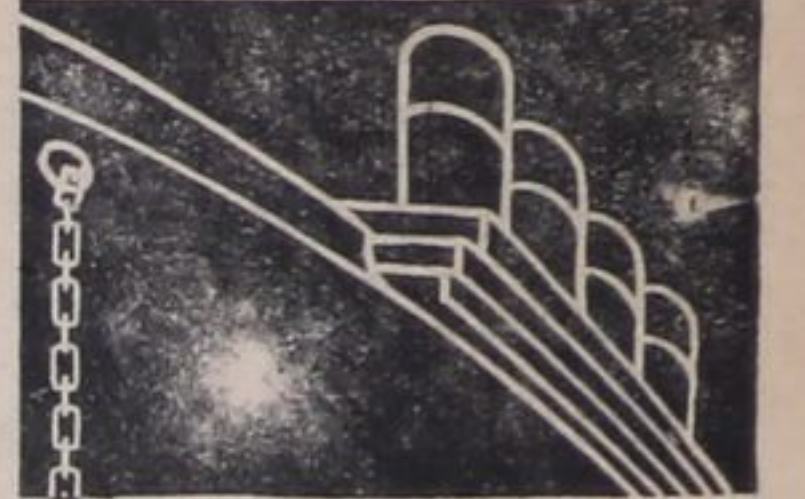

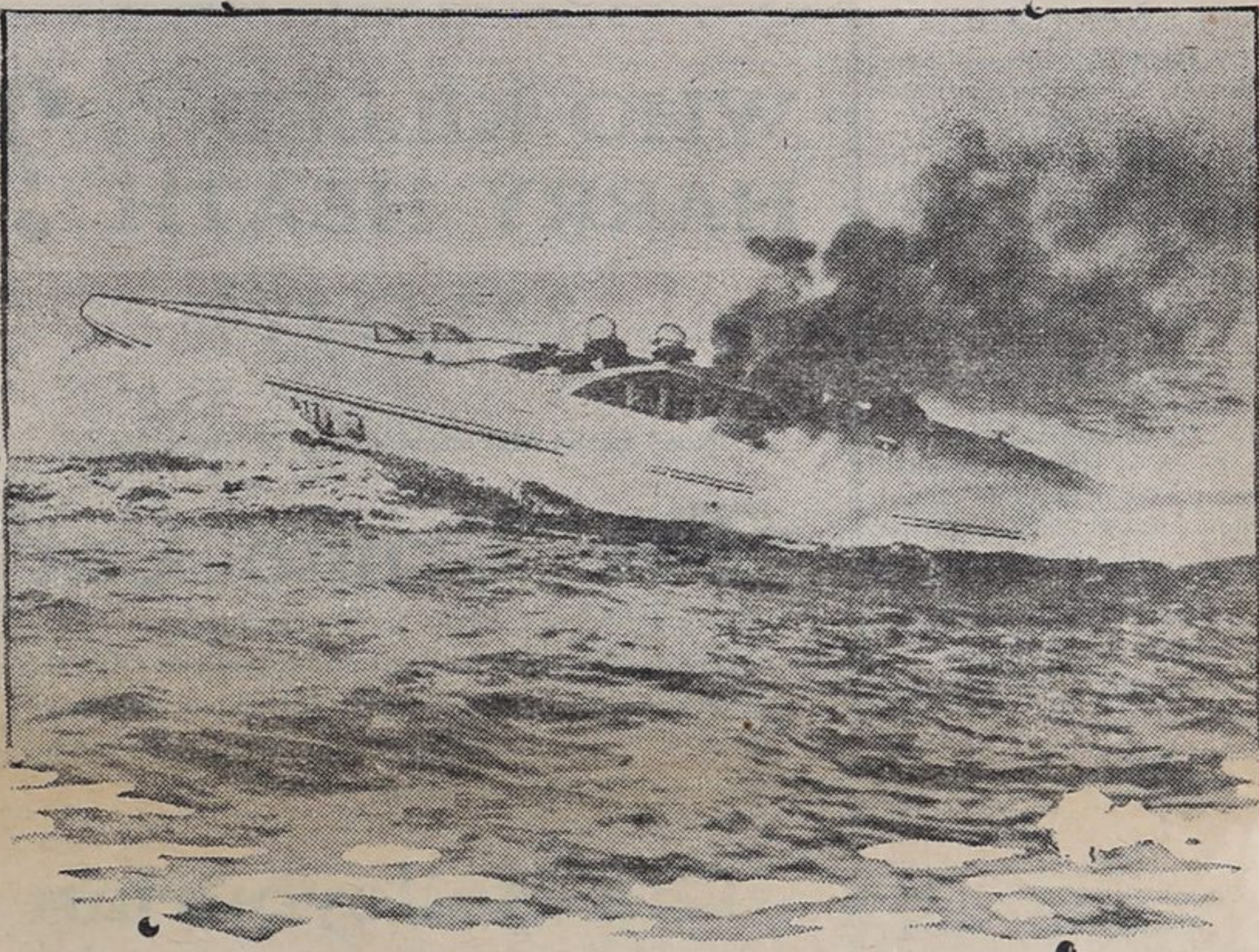

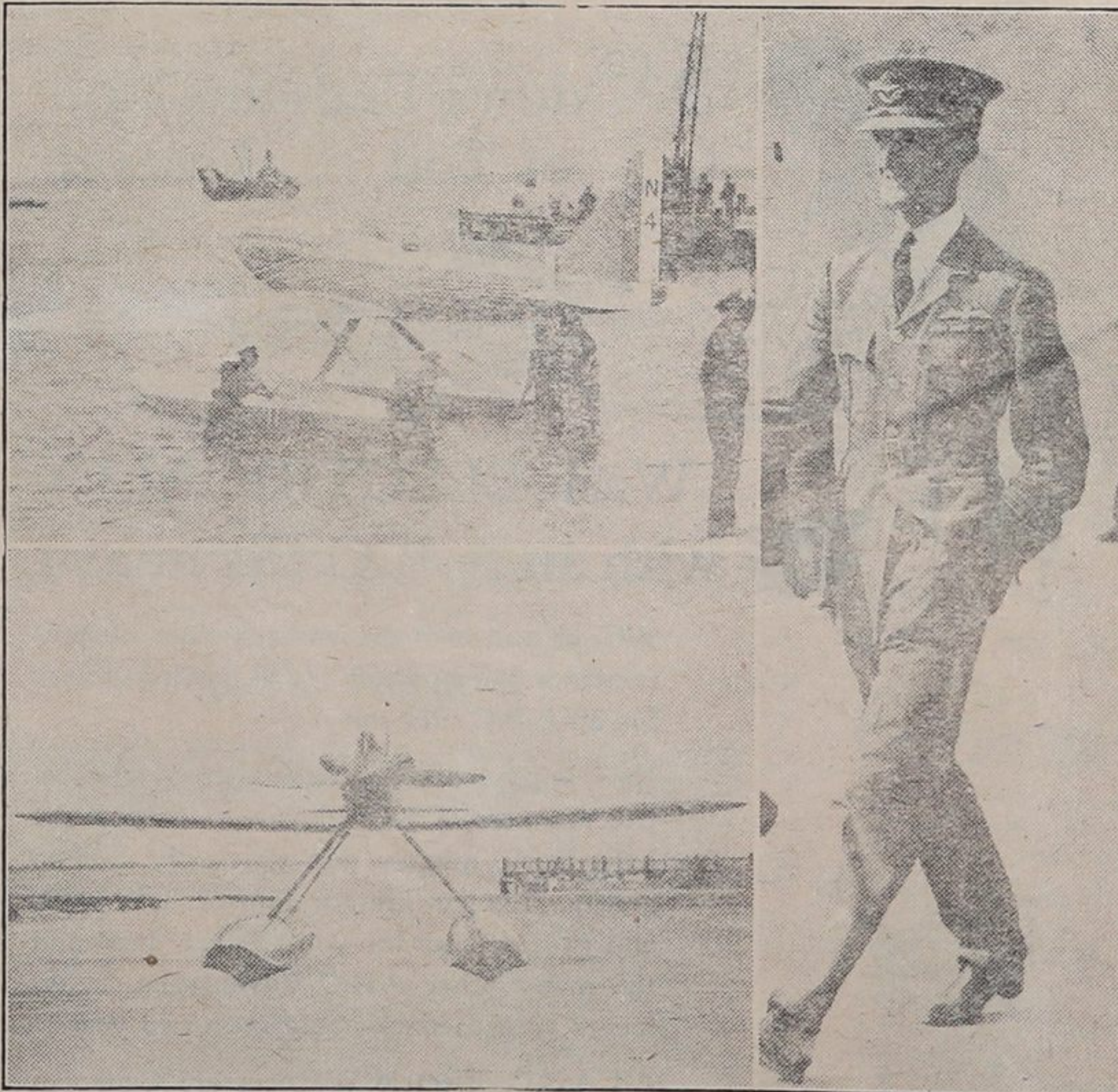

### TECHNICILITY MAY BAR "MISS ENGLAND" FROM COMPETING AT DETROIT



Just when the Old Country seems to have a good chance of recapturing the coveted Harmsworth trophy for speed boats with "Miss England II," along comes a report from Detroit that an alleged technicality in Kaye Don's challenge may bar him from racing the United States entry for the famous trophy next September. Judging by the above picture, which shows Miss England burning up the water in a trial run, it would seem to be a real threat for the world's speed boat honors.

### BRITISH PILOTS OBJECTIVE 400 MILES AN HOUR IN SCHNEIDER CUP RACES



For months the members of the British High Speed Flight have been getting into form to pilot the British seaplanes in the forthcoming Schneider Cup series, and according to latest reports the speed objective of the British team is 400 miles an hour or faster. Squadron Leader Orlebar, who is head of the High Speed Flight, and at present holder of the world's air speed record, has great faith in his team-mates and is optimistic about the Motherland's chances in the race. If England wins this year the Schneider Cup becomes her permanent possession by reason of winning it on three consecutive occasions. The pictures above show Squadron Leader Orlebar; the Super-Marine Rolls Royce seaplane (top), the type which won the Schneider Cup in 1929 and also travelled at 368 miles an hour in the world's record flight; and the Gloster Napier plane (below) which has travelled at 350 miles an hour, with a maximum speed unknown. Both these types of seaplane have been developed for this year's race.
