Weather Survey Shows February Milder This Year

Average Temperature Higher By Three Degrees But Less Sunshine

Figures sent out from the meteorological station at the Demonstration Farm at New Liskeard this week show an interesting comparison between the month of February recently passed and the same month in 1930. This year the month was milder, with an average temperature of 11.8 degrees, as against an average last year of 8.7. The lowest temperature for the month was 31 below zero, which according to the record occurred on the 7th and 10th. The lowest in February, 1930, was 48 below on the 16th.

The highest temperature of the month this year was 35 degrees, on the 25th while last year's high point for the month was 45 degrees, on the 23rd. However, last year there were 17 days.


