Youths Blamed For Burglaries Here Make Escape; One Has Surrendered

The two youths who were ar rested in North Temiskaming following a series of burglaries, and later found in possession of goods identified as belonging to local stores, escaped from the Ville Marie Lock-up on Monday evening, spent the greater part of that, night on the ice of Lake Temiskaming and finally reached this side a mile or so below Haileybury early Tuesday morning. One of the boys, the younger of the two, surrendered himself to Chief of Police MacGirr, on the advice of relatives, and is now being held here. It was not thought that the other boy, who is believed to be the one really responsible for the depradations, could remain at large very long.

The two youths had appeared in police court at Ville Marie on Tuesday, April 7th, and were remanded for a week. On the eve of their second appearance, they made good their escape from the jail and started across the ice. Both have their homes in New Liskeard and the older youth, Wesley Pocquette, is on suspended sentence for a former charge. The boy who gave himself up is Hector Gagnon and this is said to be his first time he has been in trouble with the police.


