FEE FOR PROSPECTORS' PERMITS CANCELLED BY ONTARIO GOVERNMENT

A Toronto despatch to the daily papers yesterday says: "Cancellation of the \$10 fee charged by the Ontario Government for a permit to prospect for minerals is announced, following the transfer of Ontario's forest preserves from the Lands and Forests Department to the Provincial Forestry Branch."

The fee was charged to cover the cost of the additional fire prevention work necessary by mineral prospecting. The cancellation of the fee applies particularly to the Matachewan gold area, which is in the Temagami preserve.
