Remand Ex-Traveller On Charge of False Pretences

J. A. Shibley, a former travelling salesman for the Reliance Shoe Company, was brought back to Haileybury on Monday from Toronto by Provincial Constable Allsopp, to face a charge of obtaining money under false pretences, in connection with the cashing of a draft at the Royal

Bank here. He pleaded not guilty and was remanded one week, in order that a witness from Toronto might appear to give evidence.

The charge was laid after Shibley had cashed a draft which the firm claimed he had no right to do, although he claimed he had the authority. Bail was set at \$500 cash or \$1,000 property, which the accused made no effort to provide. He will appear next Monday.

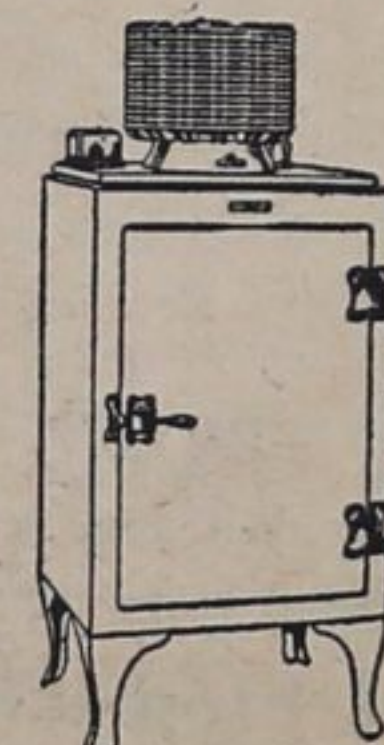
