NO DEFINITE TERM IN UNITED CHURCH RULES FOR PASTORS' SERVICES

In an item in these columns last week it was stated, in connection with the request for a change of pastorate made to the Temiskaming Presbytery by Rev. D. A. MacKeracher, that pastors of the United Church are stationed for a term of four years. This, we are informed, is not the case, and there is no definite term which they are expected to serve in one church. It was a rule of the Methodist Church that a pastor was stationed for four years, but this was never embodied in the United Church.

The system adopted at the time of the Union is similar to the Presbyterian Church, where no term is fixed. There is a provision, however, in the United Church whereby either the congregation or the minister has the privilege of applying, through their local Presbytery to the Settlement Committee of their Conference, for a change of pastoral relationship at any time.

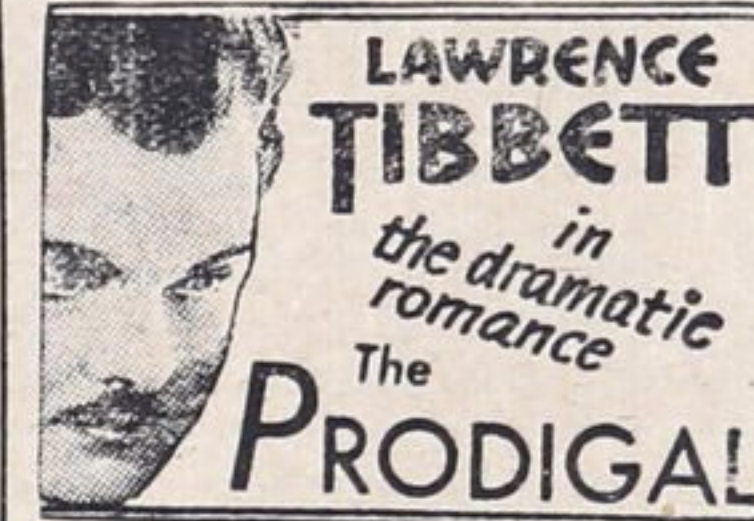
