

Toronto Boys Start Long Trip in Stolen Canoe

One Is Captured After Chase; One Escapes; Going to Matachewan

With a canoe stolen from Mr. George Guppy, Temagami guide, and provisions filched from cabins on Lake Temagami, two Toronto youths started out from the summer resort to make their way by the lake route into the Matachewan district.

Albert Arnott, aged 16, and Ralph Sharp, 15, were the two adventurers, and the former was captured on Thursday last by Provincial Constable Walker, who was assisted in following the pair by Mr. Guppy. He was taken to North Bay later, where he appeared in police court Monday and was remanded for two weeks. Sharpe is still at large and is believed to be somewhere in the district. A strict watch is being kept up and it is expected that he will not be able to evade arrest for very long.

The pair left Temagami May 2nd, taking with them a canoe belonging to George Guppy, and are alleged to have taken provisions and supplies from several cabins on the lake. They evidently made their way through Lady Evelyn Lake to Mattawapika Falls, before Constable Walker and Guppy caught up with them. There they were found in a forestry cabin, where Arnott was arrested and the canoe and some supplies recovered. Sharp made his escape through a rear window of the cabin and managed to elude his pursuers and get into the bush.

The canoe in which the youths started on their tour, which was to take them into the Matachewan district, had been painted over by them and traces of the fresh paint at places where they had stopped, helped the officer and his guide to follow the trail through the lakes. After his companion had been arrested Sharp reached a depot of McLellan's, between the Mattawapika and Latchford, where he is alleged to have again equipped himself with a canoe, some food and clothing and a small sum of money. Up to last night no trace of him had been found.

CLASSES IN PHYSICAL INSTRUCTION END FOR SEASON TOMORROW

Mr. B. W. Hartley, who for the past couple of years has carried on physical instruction classes, announces that these will be discontinued for the season with those held at 7 and 8 p.m. tomorrow, Friday, evening. Mr. Hartley has given unsparingly of his time and talents along this line and has done a really good work for the young folks, who have received training that will prove of great value in the years to come.

NEW REGULATIONS FOR AIRCRAFT OPERATORS ENTERING THE STATES

The Department of National Defence has issued the following under date of May 12th:

Under the United States' Immigration law, it is necessary for all aircraft entering the United States to carry on board a list of the passengers and crew. These lists or manifests may be obtained upon prepayment from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. The lists must be delivered to the immigration Officer at the customs airport where the first landing is made in United States territory.

There is a civil penalty of \$500 for a violation of the Immigration law so all owners, operators and pilots of aircraft, entering the United States from Canada should make themselves familiar with both customs and Immigration laws and be in possession of the required documents and personnel list.
