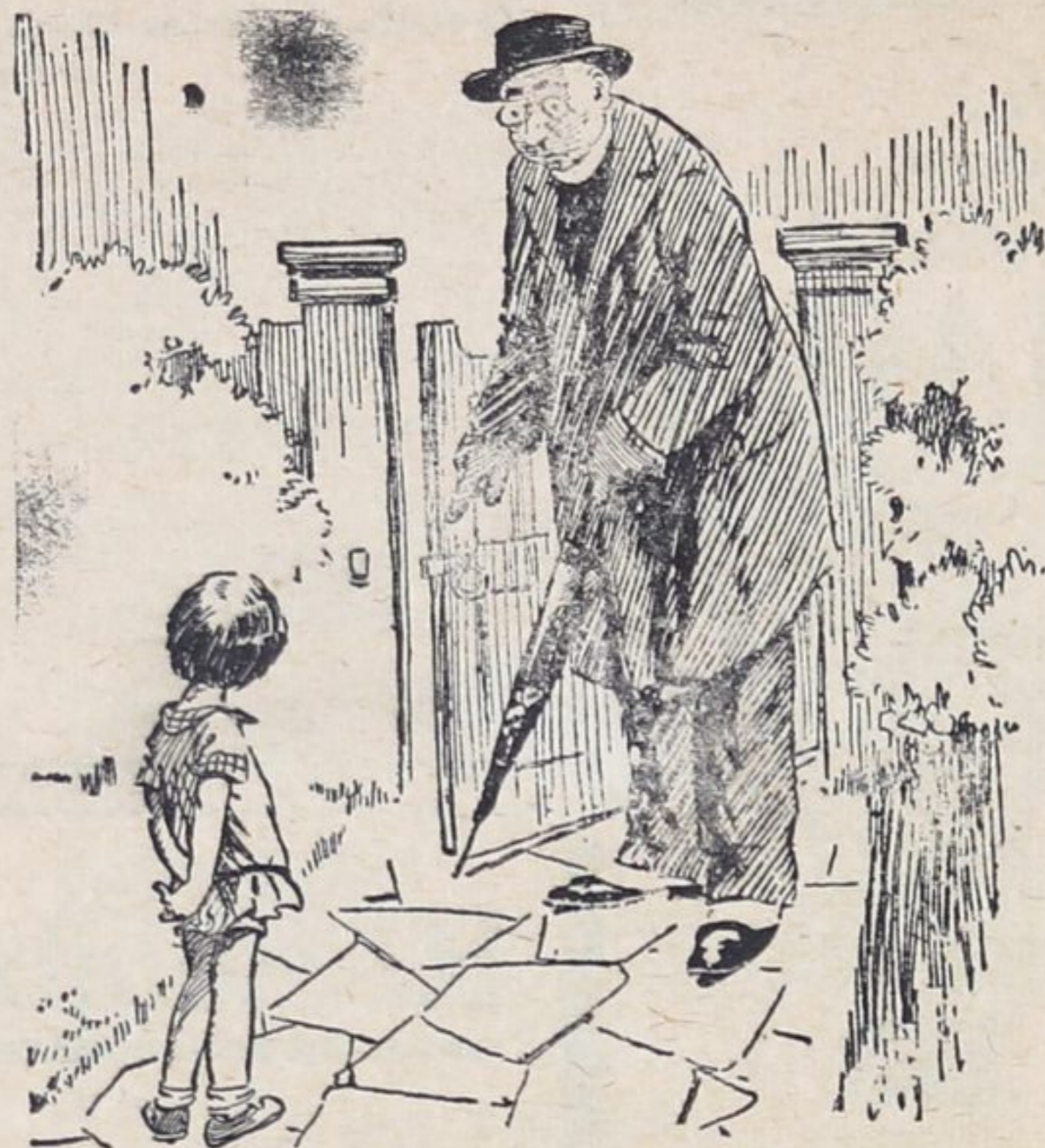

FORMER RESIDENT OF HAILEYBURY DROWNED NEAR MICHIGAN HOME

Friends in Haileybury received word this week of the drowning of a former resident, in the person of Frank H. Hoard, which occurred near his home in Marquette, Mich., on Sunday, May 3rd. He was out with a fishing party and was alone at the time, so it is doubtful if the cause will ever be known. When found the body was partly floating in a lake.

The Hoard family lived in Haileybury for a number of years and were well known. Mr. Hoard was 65 years old and leaves his widow, three daughters and two sons, all of whom have their present homes in Michigan. He was a prominent Mason and at the time of his death held membership in Bethel Lodge, A.F. & A.M., Sault Ste Marie, Cobalt Chapter, R.A.M., the Knights Templar, Rameses Temple of the Mystic Shrine, and the Eastern Star at Evansport, Ohio.
