

### Holds Service of Confirmation At St. Paul's

Candidates Receive Laying on of Hands by Anglican Bishop of Algoma

Right Rev. Rocksborough R. Smith, Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Algoma, was in Haileybury over the week-end and at the morning service in St. Paul's Church on Sunday conferred the holy rite of Confirmation, the "Laying on of Hands", on a class of candidates presented by the rector, Rev. Canon Hincks. The church was well filled for the service and the solemn ceremony was followed closely by all.

Following the Confirmation service, His Lordship spoke earnestly to the class in particular, and to the whole congregation. He told them that they should be proud of the Church of England, which had had its origin in a meeting of the twelve disciples after the ascension of Christ, when they received the Holy Spirit. From that time to the present the Church had carried on the work laid down by the Saviour Himself, and had progressed steadily under persecution.

Bishop Smith pictured the Church with one hand stretched out and holding fast to the traditions of the past, while with the other she reached forward and grasped the things which changing conditions made necessary in the world today. Throughout the years, when the Church had felt inspired by the Holy Ghost, he said, she had steadily progressed, until now there is scarcely a moment of the day or night when church bells are not ringing in some part of the world.

Speaking directly to the class which had been confirmed, the Bishop outlined what their duties towards the church should be, under four different heads. First prayer, an outline of what should constitute their daily supplications; second, the regular attendance at the service of Holy Communion, in order that they might receive the inspiration of the Holy Spirit; third, they should support the clergy and be true and loyal to them because they represent Christ on earth; fourth, they should do something to spread the gospel, which was the duty, not of the clergy alone, but of all members of the church. His Lordship made a very impressive plea to the young to observe and carry out these phases of their religious life.

The Bishop arrived in Haileybury on Saturday morning and was the guest of Rev. Canon and Mrs. Hincks at the rectory. He was the celebrant at the Holy Communion service in the church at 8 a.m. on Sunday. On Monday

evening, Canon Hincks and Mrs. Hincks were at home to members of the congregation and their friends at the rectory, when Bishop Smith was an honored guest and where he met many members of the church in Haileybury. He is this week visiting other sections of this part of the diocese before returning to Sault, Ste Marie.

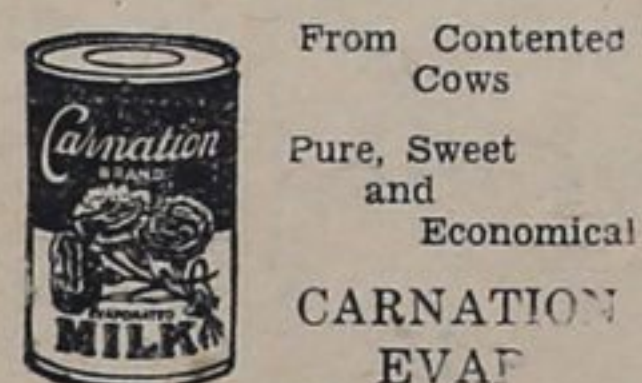
