The second fatality in the same family in less than 10 weeks occurred at the Teck Hughes mine, Kirkland Lake, about 10.30 Tuesday night, when Sinklor Morrow, 26 years old, and unmarried, was killed in a fall of rock at a chute while working underground at the property. Deceased was a son of Mr. and Mrs. James Morrow, well-known settlers of Hudson township, near New Liskeard and the body was sent there yesterday. A brother of the victim, Eldred Morrow, died in Cobalt hospital on May 22 last from burns sustained in an accident at the Matabichouan plant of the Canada Northern Power Co., where he had been employed. An inquest has been ordered into the fatality here. Morrow had been with the mining company for a year past.


