"Captain Evered is the hero of a hundred fights. He has eluded death a score of times. For four months he lay on his back with a fought throughout the Crimean war on sea and land. Hear him tell in his own lively way some of his adventures.

"There were three of us together doing reconnaisance work," he said. "We had dismounted from our horses and got away from out flank. I saw through my glasses a group of Cossacks approaching. They came nearer till it was getting far from safe. My companions mounted to ride away, when my horse-she was white, I remember-took it into her head to bolt. Another minute and I should have been lost, but I leapt after the horse, clutched her mane, and together we dashed for safety."

"I was given my Lieutenant's commission for saving some women from the Cossacks. My captain told me to take two boats and such men as I wanted and do our best. It was a tough job getting the women from those rascals. They blazed away at us and we had to lower the women into our boats by the hair of their heads in some cases. But we brought them safely away.

"Another time those Russians shortened the fuses of our batteries. I was wounded in the explosion, and the medico said afterwards, 'Mr. Evered, if you no had six layers of clothing on,
