MIDNIGHT BATTLE ON STREET LAST JULY HAS SEQUEL IN COURT HERE

A midnight battle between two natives of Jugo-Slavia on a Kirkland Lake street last July, had its sequel in court here on Tuesday morning when His Honor Judge Hartman assessed the sum of \$25 and costs against Pete Kalembar for an alleged assault on the person of L. Zigich. Kalembar had been charged with causing bodily harm to Zigich and had elected for a speedy trial before the Judge.

The evidence was of a contradictory nature, both parties claiming that the other had been the aggressor. The complainant had kept a boarding house and the defendant, who had at one time boarded there, left and established a rival establishment. There was evidence from both provincial and municipal police describing the scrap, which had ended in the arrest of both parties. Zigich had been released the following day and had laid the charge. His Honor, before imposing the fine, said he did not believe the evidence, except that of the police, and that the case was not a serious one.

Pleads Guilty on Charges Given Two Year Sentence

Apeparing before Judge Hartman here yesterday, Fred Miron, young river driver, tendered a plea of guilty to two charges involving indecent assault and aggravated assault, and was sentenced to two years in Kingston, the terms to be concurrent. Accused was represented by George Mitchell, K.C., who appealed to the bench to date the sentences back to the time of Miron's incarceration in the district jail, where he has been held since July but the plea was rejected.

Miron came off a river drive in the summer and it was while he was a roomer at the home of Mr. and Mrs. George Groves, elderly residents of Cobalt, that the offences complained of took place, according to evidence given at the preliminary hearing some months ago.

TAKES CONTRACT TO CLEAR RIGHT OF WAY FOR NEW WATER LINE

A contract has been let for the clearing of the right-of-way for the new water line from Constance Lake to the reservoir and work on that part of the job commenced late last week. M. O'Halloran, a local man, has the job and has a number of men employed.

The line runs chiefly through the undergrowth and there is considerable work in connection with the clearing. A roadway for the hauling of the pipe has to be provided and, as the trenching is to be done by machines, the right-of-way will necessarily have to be cleared to a considerable width. Just when the contractors, McNamara Bros. Construction Company, will start on the trenching is not known yet, but the contract calls for completion of the job by January 15th, 1932.

Seek Damages of \$40,000 in Loss Young Boy's Leg

Schumacher Parties in Case to Be Tried By Judge and Jury in Haileybury

An action in which damages of \$40,000 are being asked as the result of injuries sustained by a Schumacher boy who was seriously injured in an accident there more than a year ago that he lost one leg, has been set down for trial at the Supreme Court sittings here, scheduled to open before Mr. Justice Sedgewick on December 8th next. The case has been transferred from Cochrane at plaintiff's request, and will be tried before judge and jury.

Allan Keeley, a minor, and his father, Daniel B. Keeley, mining engineer, are suing Owen L. Evans, of Timmins, claiming that the last named's alleged negligence in driving his automobile resulted in the accident to the younger plaintiff, who was riding a bicycle on a road on the McIntyre mines property on October 11, 1930. Car and bicycle collided, and the plaintiffs allege that Evans was on the wrong side of the road, that he failed to blow his horn, that brakes and steering gear were defective and that he drove "with utter disregard of the rules of the road."
