TWO-YEAR-OLD ROW OVER FIFTY CENT MEAL ENDS IN COURT ON SATURDAY

Pleading guilty to a charge of causing grievous bodily harm to the person of W. B. Nicholson, in a row over the price of a fifty-cent meal, Charlie Chow, a former restaurant keeper at Kirkland Lake, was fined \$100 by Judge Hartman in district court here on Saturday. Chow was to have come up for trial at the sessions in June of last year, but he disappeared and his bail of \$1,000 was forfeited. It had cost the Crown \$275 to prepare for trial at that time. Crown Attorney F. L. Smiley, K.C., told the court.
