Mike Skakoon Hanged on Friday Second Execution in the District Jail Here

For the second time since the district jail was built here, a convicted murderer has paid the extreme penalty of the law, when Mike Skakoon, sentenced at the sprinz assizes in Cochrane last April, was hanged early on Friday morning last. It was at a few minutes after midnight that the hanging took place. The condemned man maintained his composure to the last, it is said, and did not falter when he was taken from the death cell to the scaffold, which had been And just sometimes we pause, erected inside the jail.
