

Big Delegation of Farmers will Invade Ottawa

Will Ask Freer Empire Trade on Eve of Economic Conference; Excursion Planned

A monster delegation of Ontario farmers will visit Ottawa on the eve of the coming Economic Conference to place before the Government their problems and seek a measure of freer Empire trade as an outcome of the conference. July 16 is the date set for the visit and it is expected that at least 2,000 agrarians will visit the capital and endeavor to impress on the Cabinet the great importance of dealing with agricultural problems when the representatives of the Empire get together on July 21.

R. J. Scott, of Belgrave, President, and J. J. Morrison, secretary of the United Farmers of Ontario will head the delegation and it is expected that representatives of all farmers' organizations in the province will be present. Arrangements have been made for a special train from Toronto to Ottawa at the greatly reduced fare of \$4.50, with correspondingly low rates from other points. Separate coaches will be provided for ladies.

Mr. Morrison said that the farmers were eager to impress on the government their feeling that Canada must buy from Britain if Britain was to provide a preferred market for Canada's primary products. The Canadian manufacturers had been expressing their views; it was equally right that the voice of agriculture be heard, Mr. Morrison declared. Plans were not completed in regard to the requests to be presented when the announcement was made. A meeting would be held in Ottawa previous to the interview with the government.

This will be the second time in recent years that farmers of Ontario have invaded the capital. The previous occasion was on May 14, 1918, when the purpose of the visit was to protest against the conscription of farmers' sons for military service in the great war. Out of that march to Ottawa came the impetus credited with the creation of the Farmers' Government in Ontario in 1919.
