

Dept. of Mines is Making Tests of Various Ores

Every Mining Province in Dominion Is Represented in List Now Released

A list of metalliferous ores on which milling and concentration tests are being conducted in the ore dressing laboratories of the Department of Mines, Ottawa, has been released for publication. The list comprises ores from every mining province in the Dominion with gold ores from several of the recent discoveries and from the younger operating companies well in the lead. The list follows:

Gold ores from the Province of Ontario, including the Ashley property of the Mining Corporation of Canada, Matachewan; De Santis Gold Mines Limited, Timmins; McKellar-Longworth property of the Schreiber Gold Mines Limited, Schreiber; Cameron Island Arsenical Gold Ore, Lake of the Woods.

Gold ores from the Province of Quebec, including the Beattie Gold Mines Limited, Duparquet township; Granada Gold Mines Limited, Rouyn township; Arntfield Mines Limited, Boischatel township; Germaine-Gale property, Dubouison township; Treadwell-Yukon Mines Limited, Pascalis township.

Gold ores from the Province of Manitoba, including the Island Lake property of Ventures Limited and the Herb Lake property of C. B. Morgan.

Gold ores from British Columbia, including Pioneer and Bralorne Mines, Bridge River district; Alexandria Mines, Phillips Arm, Shoal Bay; Clancy and Kinsey, Alice Lake property, Jeune Landing, Vancouver, B.C.; Canada Smelters Limited, Sanca; Cariboo Gold Quartz Mining Company Limited, Barkerville.

Black Sand Concentrates containing gold from North Bend, B.C., and from the McLeod River Mining Company, Peers, Alberta.

Cobalt ore from Kenora Prospectors Limited, Werner Lake, Patricia district, Ont.

Copper-Nickel-Cobalt ore from Shebandowan Lake, Port Arthur district, Ontario.

Scheelite ore from Indian Path Mines Limited, Lunenburg, N. S.

Iron ore from Bathurst Iron Mines, Bathurst, N.E.

Most evanescent are most sweet.

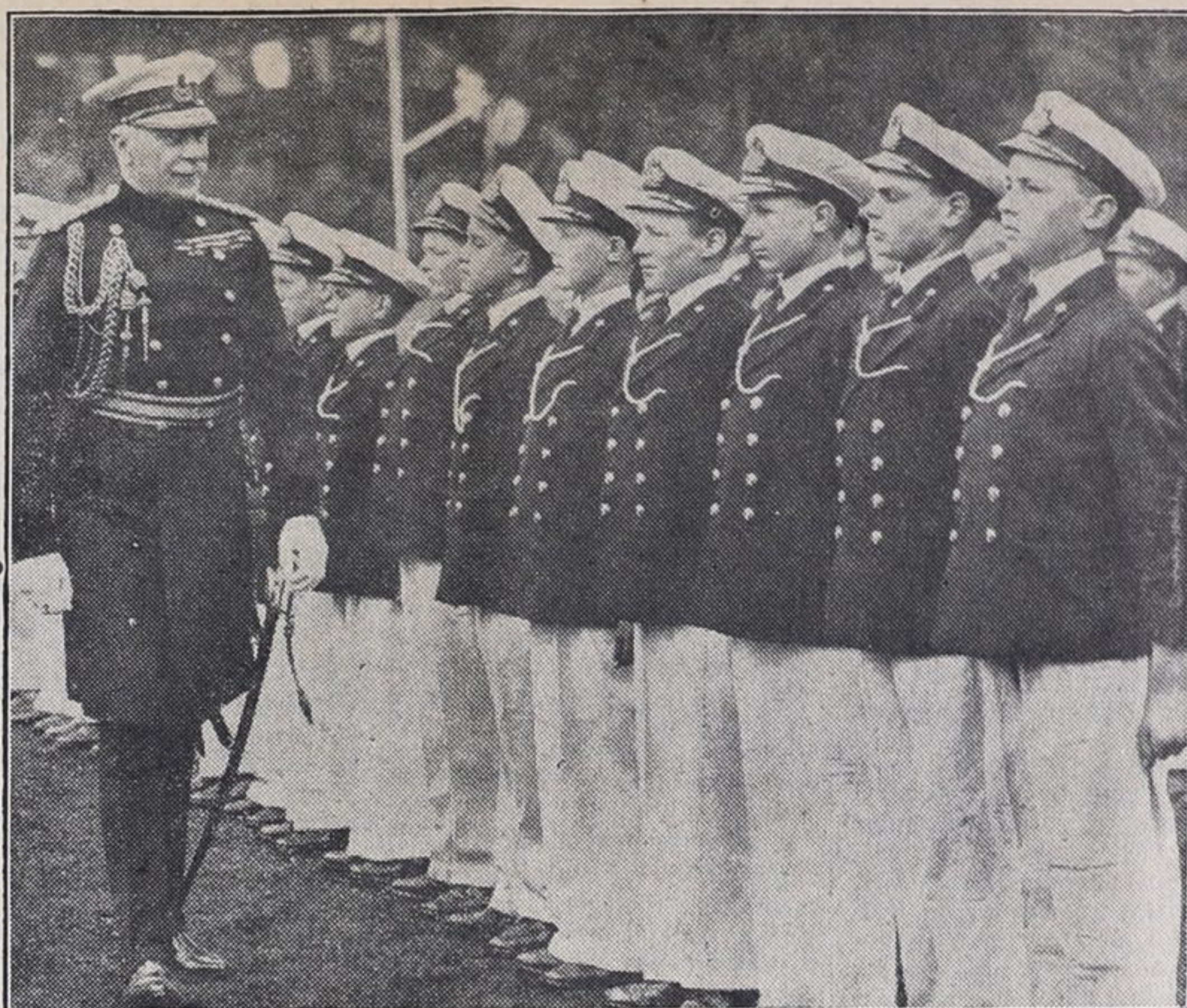
Ah, trust the future; it will bring

The trees were all planted since the big fire of 1922 and have grown very fast.
