CONTINUED INCREASE IN EARNINGS SHOWN BY POWER CORPORATION

A letter to the shareholders of Canada Northern Power Corporation, Limited, from the general manager, B. V. Harrison, points to a continued increase in both gross and net earnings of the company during the 12 months ending February 28th, 1933.

"During the period covered by this letter, your Company set up two all-time records, gross earnings in December exceeding the \$300,000 mark by \$2,298.00, which was again increased in January to \$306,688.00.

During January an addition to the mill at Granada Mines, Limited, in Rosyn Township was placed in operation, thereby increasing their power load.

On February 15th a contract for the supply of power was entered into with Beattie Gold Mines, Limited, whose property is in Duparquet Township in Quebec.

In the Porcupine camp, Hayden Gold Mines, Limited have completed an addition to their mill, while at the McIntyre work has been commenced on the sinking of their new underground shaft from the 3750 foot level."

Samples of the ore from the claim assayed \$21.60 in gold, according to The Journal, with 19 cents in silver values.

described, we climb up the seven rapids to Matachewan Lake, and having had fine weather we arrived back at Fort Matachewan in eleven days, carry our load to the store-house, return all our travelling material, turn our canoes bottom up on the beach, laying the poles alongside them, ready for the next trip.

We made two more trips the same summer, one over the same route and one down the Montreal river, portaging over Hickey's farm to Matachewan and up Lake Temiscamingue to the old Fort.

On arrival at Fort Matachewan each man receives one day's ration, two pounds of flour, half a pound of pork and one quarter of a pound lard, that being the home allowance at the Fort.
