**Temperature in  
April is Slightly  
Above Last Year**

**Month Was Cooler Than Average  
With Rainfall Lighter and  
Sunshine 124 Hours**

An average temperature above that of the same month last year, but still slightly below the average for the past 30 years, is one of the features of the summary of weather conditions during April, 1933, as compiled by Jas. Reavell at the meteorological station in Haileybury. The mean temperature for the month was 36.6 degrees, compared to 33.0 in 1932 and 38.0 as the mean for the 30 years during which records have been kept. There was registered a maximum temperature of 62 degrees and a minimum of 17 degrees, while the figures for the month last year were 73 and two respectively.

The rainfall for the month was 1.99 inches, which is higher than last year, when a total of 1.11 inches was registered and is up on the average which stands at 1.38. Snowfall is registered as .57 inches, compared with .89 in April 1932, and an average of .60 for the 30 years. The sun shone brightly for 124 hours during the month.

The average wind velocity for the month was 7.68 miles per hour. This is slightly below the record for the month last year, when the average was 7.9 miles. The total mileage recorded was 5,296, compared with last year's total of 5,699. The maximum velocity for the month was 22 miles per hour, from the southwest on the 13th, while the longest continuous wind blew from the southeast on the 6th, a total of 18 hours and a mileage of 135. The prevailing wind, however, was from the northwest, with a total of 1,215 miles in 140 hours recorded. There were just nine calm hours during the month.

**American Consulate at  
North Bay Closes June 30**

The American Consulate at North Bay, which has been carried on for many years, will be closed on June 30, according to a notice sent out last week by the Consul, H. C. von Struve. The business will be transferred to the Consulate General at Toronto and all persons in this part of Northern Ontario desiring to go to the United States or having other business in connection with that country will have to communicate with the Toronto office. Changed conditions are given as the reason for the closing of the North Bay Consulate and it is expected that the officers there will be assigned to other posts in the service, not as yet selected.

**Over a Hundred Visit City

**Three Towns to  
Give Receptions  
to Gov.-General**

**Tentative Plans Made Friday  
Include Unveiling of the  
Drummond Memorial**

Plans for entertaining the Governor-General of Canada and other members of the vice-regal party when they visit New Liskeard, Haileybury and Cobalt and district on the afternoon of June 6th next were discussed at a meeting held in Cobalt last Friday morning, and at which Geo. W. Lee, chairman and Cols. L. T. Martin and J. I. McLaren, members, of the T. & N.O. Commission were present.

Tentative arrangements made then included receptions to be tendered His Excellency in each town, and New Liskeard, through Mayor C. A. Byam, and Haileybury, through Mayor G. T. Hamilton, offered to give part of the time allotted to their respective towns to Cobalt in order that the Earl and Countess of Bessborough and their party may be able to participate in the ceremonies at the unveiling of the memorial plaque to the late Dr. W. H. Drummond.

This event will take place at the Drummond mine during the afternoon, and it is expected the Governor-General will deliver a brief address then. Changed plans have left only three hours available for the three towns, it is stated, and the party will not

reach Cobalt before 1.50 p.m., at the earliest, while departure has to be made from New Liskeard by five o'clock.

Present at the meeting on Friday morning were Mayor Byam and Councillor R. S. Taylor, New Liskeard, with M. B. Auger, president of the Board of Trade there; Mayor Hamilton and O. J. Thorpe, Haileybury; Mayor Wainwright and Dr. Armstrong, Cobalt, with Rev. E. Gilmour Smith, representing the Cobalt Kiwanis Club, sponsoring the Drummond memorial celebration, and which includes a banquet at night.

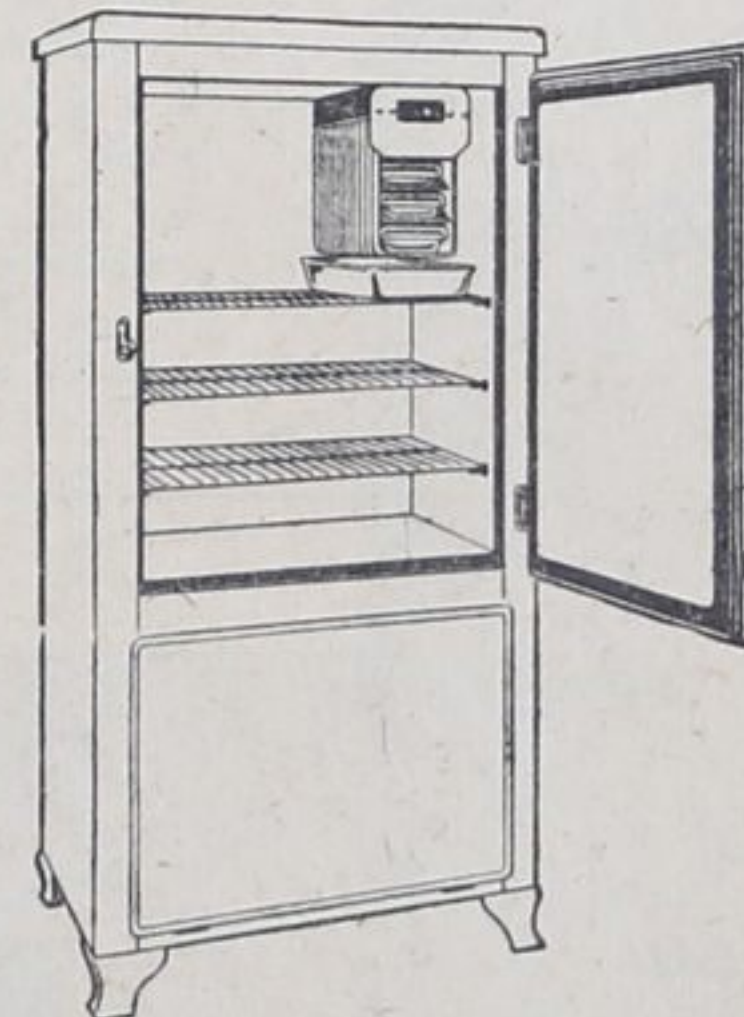
