

Cobalt Students Win Track Meet at New Liskeard

Seventy-One Students Take Part and Seven Standards Are Exceeded; On to City

Seventy-one students from five Northern schools participated in the Ontario Athletic Commission No. 9 district athletic meet, held in Liskeard last Saturday afternoon, with Cobalt emerging as winner and Timmins taking the runner-up position.

Seven contenders, five from Cobalt, and two from Timmins, exceeded the standards set to qualify for the provincial finals, to be run off in Toronto on Friday, June 26th.

In the senior class, Holouka of Cobalt qualified in the javelin, by adding two feet seven inches to the standard.

In the intermediate shot put, G. Aldo of Cobalt bettered the required distance. Beland of Cobalt knocked 11-5 seconds off the 440 yard run, while Bandiero of Timmins qualified in the junior shot put.

Haileybury boys made their bid in the junior events, with Gordon Ruttan winning both the broad and high jump events, and R. Pipe being second in the shot put and third in the 100-yards.

In the intermediate class, Bob Carlson, Haileybury, was second in the half-mile run.

Weather and track conditions were excellent and some disappointment was expressed when more standards were not equalled or bettered.
