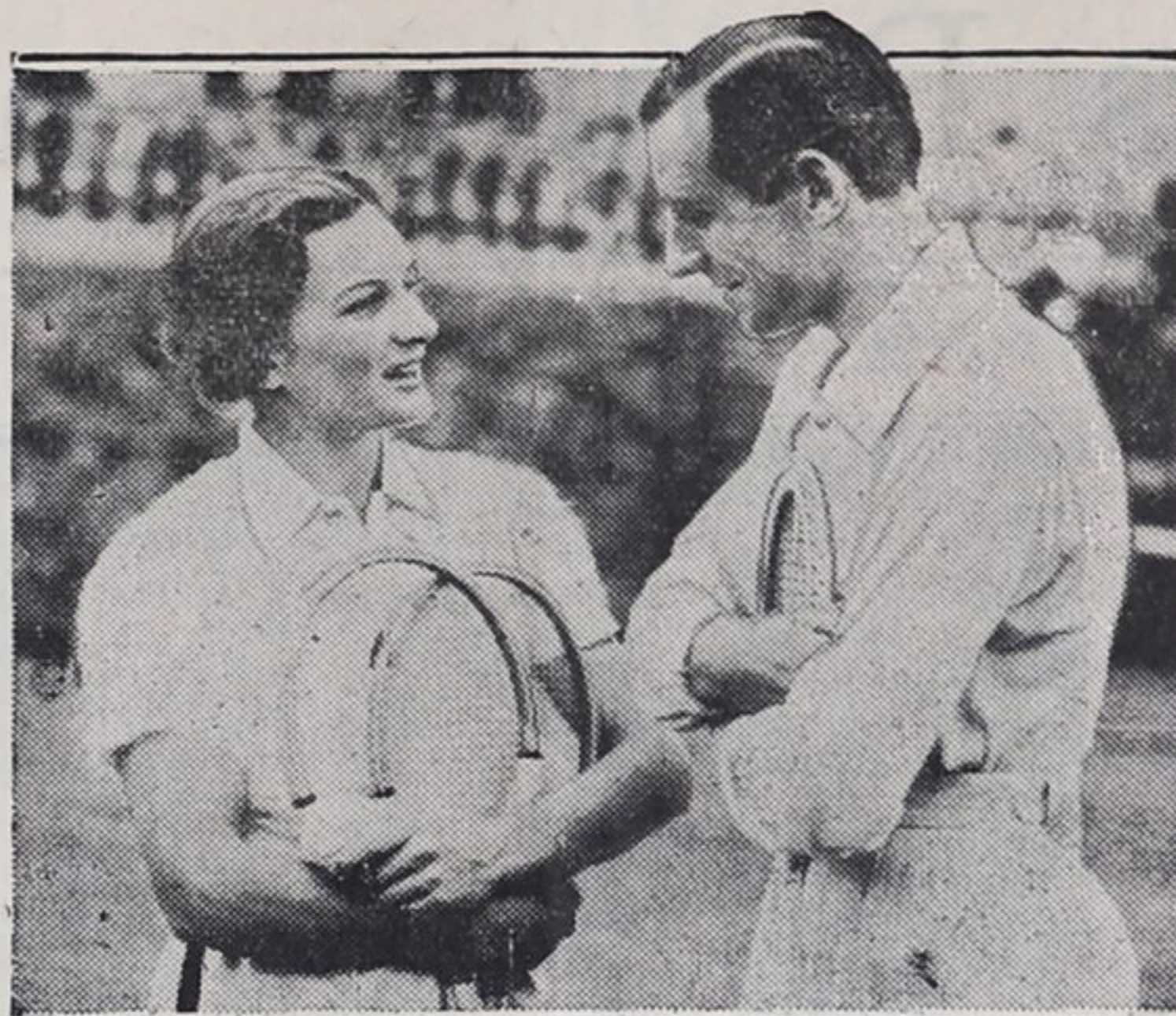
### Tennis Club President is Winner of Men's Section

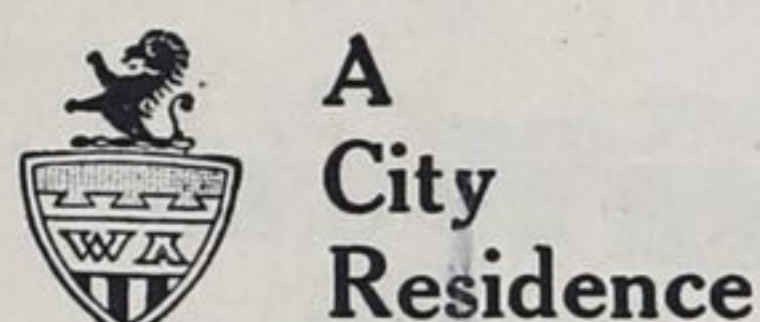

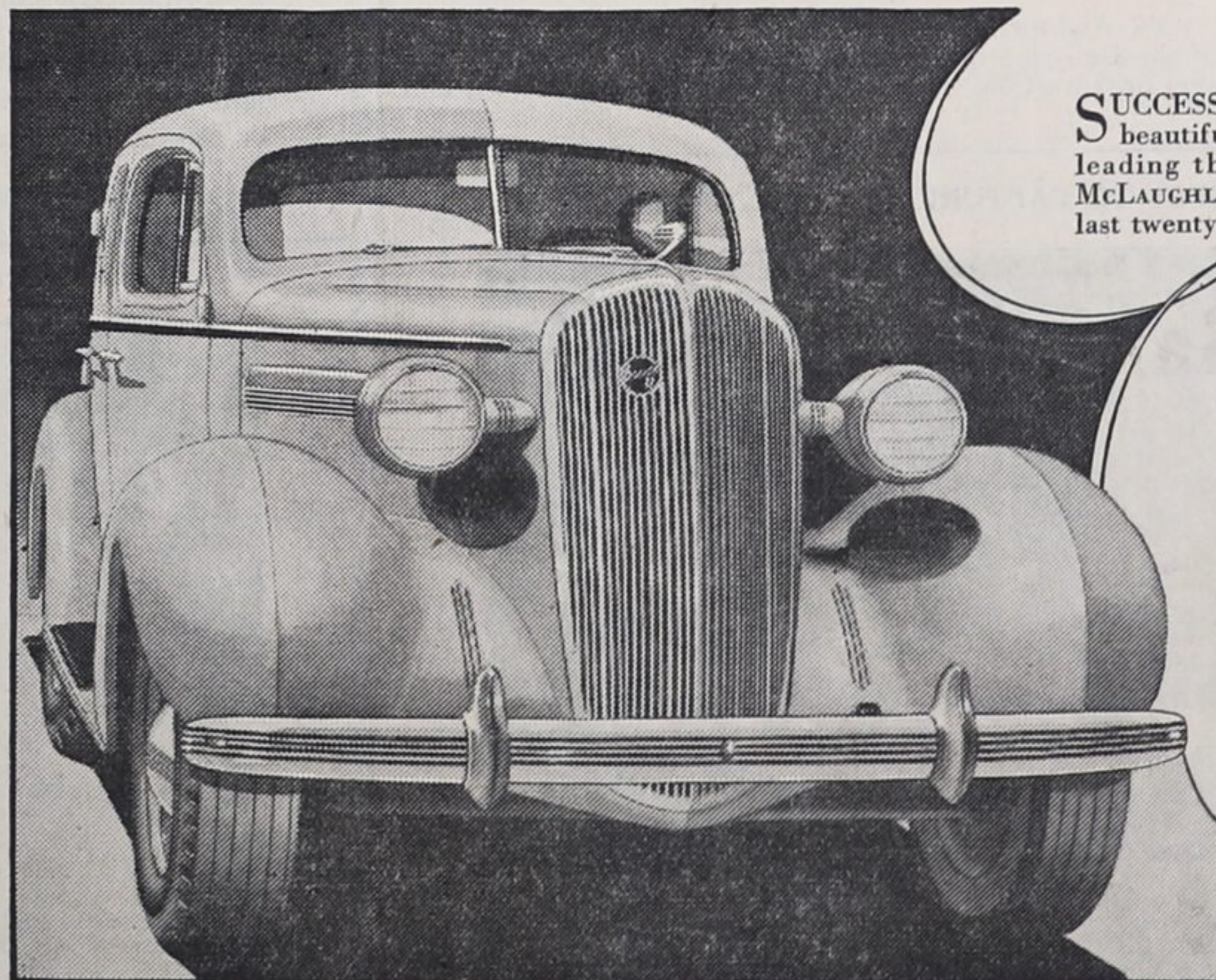
