Boy Hurt on Highway in Motor Accident Tuesday

Charley Maille, 10-year-old Earleton boy, is in Englehart hospital with a cut in his head and bruises as a result of being hit by a motor car on the Ferguson Highway about a mile from his home while returning from school on Tuesday. The accident was reported to provincial police headquarters here and officers learned that the boy was one of a party of four and that when the car was approaching, three ran to one side of the road and one to the other, with the result that the Maille boy was struck. The car, driven by John Hunter, was brought to a stop in 25 feet and Mrs. Hunter, accompanying her husband, arranged to have the lad taken to hospital, while Mr. Hunter remained until the police arrived. The boy's injuries are not believed to be serious.

OBITUARY

THOS. D. CARMICHAEL

A resident of Haileybury from about 1909 until he went to Toronto a few years ago, Thos D. Carmichael passed away in the city early yesterday morning, September 16th, 1936, after an illness of considerable length.

He was 75 years of age, was born in Beachburg, Ont., and followed the prospecting and mining industry during the greater part of his residence in the North Country.

Mr. Carmichael was a veteran of the great war, having served overseas with the Canadian Forestry Corps in 1917 and 1918. On his return he remained in Haileybury for several years and was one of those to suffer the loss of his home in the fire of October, 1922, afterwards rebuilding on Blackwall Street. Surviving are his widow and three sons, Hugh, in Haileybury, D. A., at present in Toronto, and Kenneth, in the mining fields.

ALEXANDER D. STARK

Alexander D. Stark, a resident of Cobalt for many years, died at the Municipal Hospital there on Tuesday, September 15th, after an illness of several years. He was 45 years of age, was born in Avonmore, Ont., and during his residence in the North had been employed at the old Cobalt Reduction, the Barry-Hollinger and the Croesus mines. Mr. Stark was unmarried and was a brother of Mrs. J. E. Grant of Haileybury. The remains were sent yesterday evening to Finch, Ont., for burial.

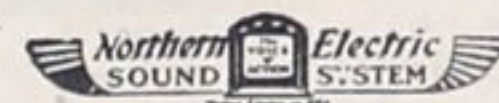

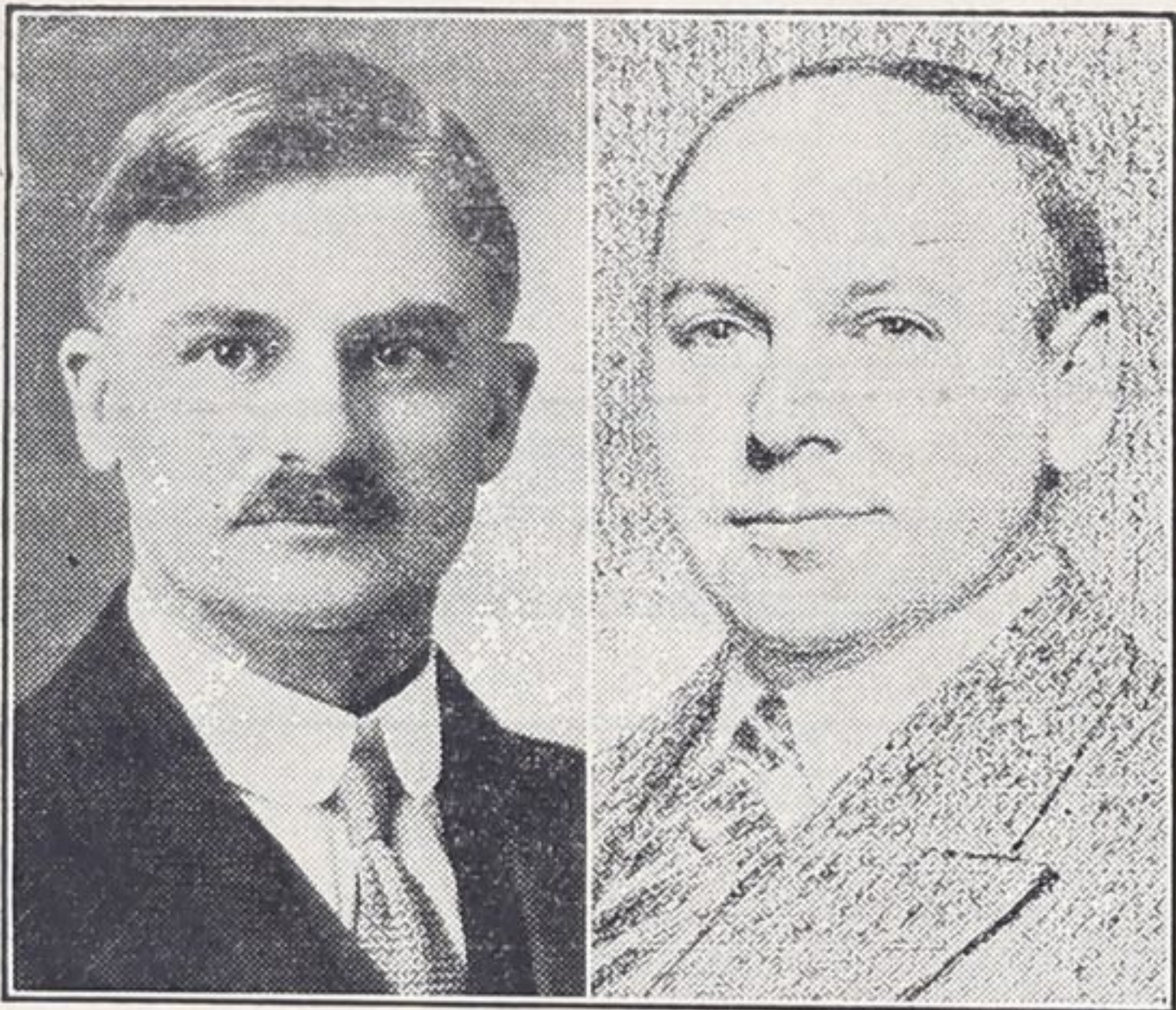
