

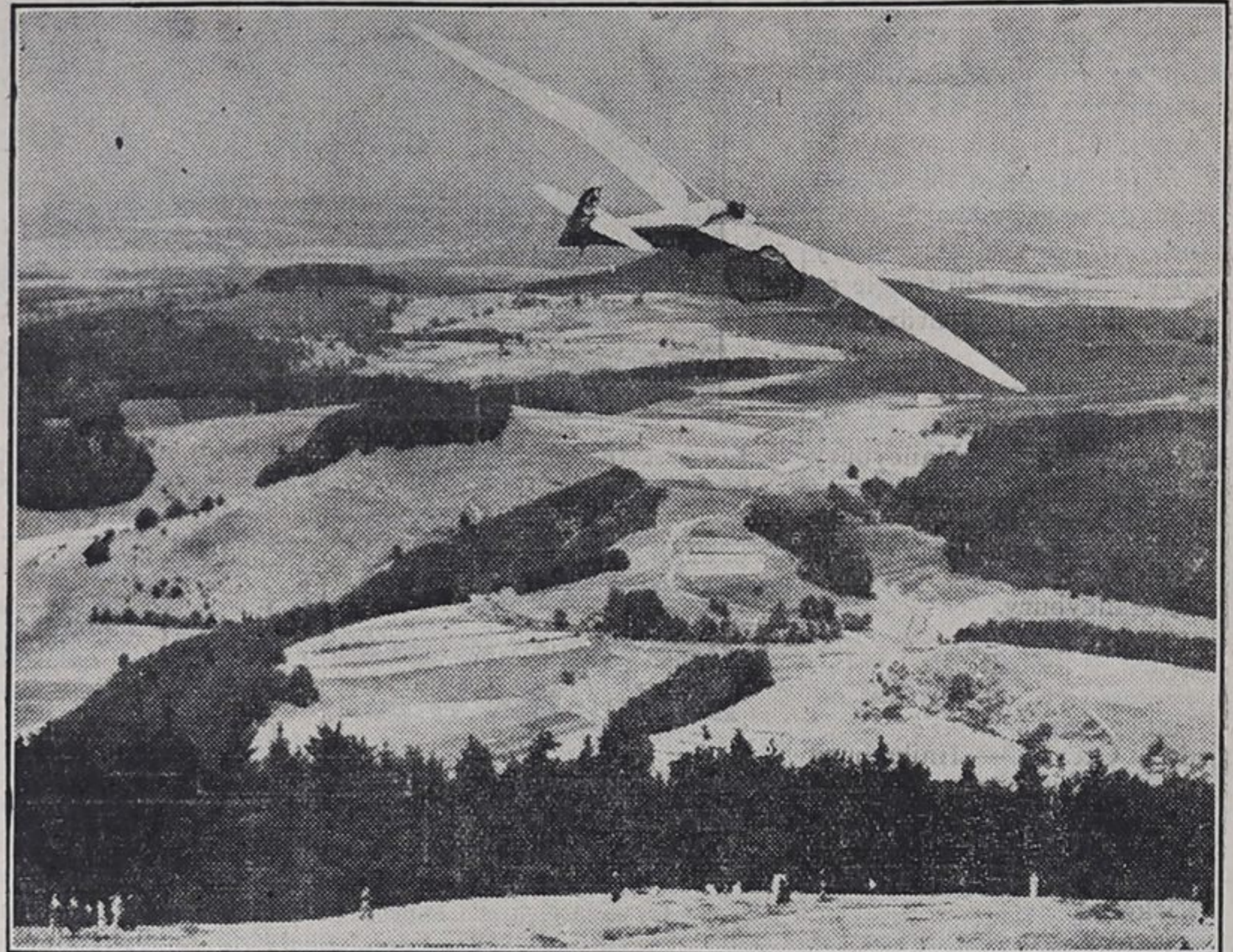

COMMEMORATE ANNIVERSARY OF FAMOUS BATTLE



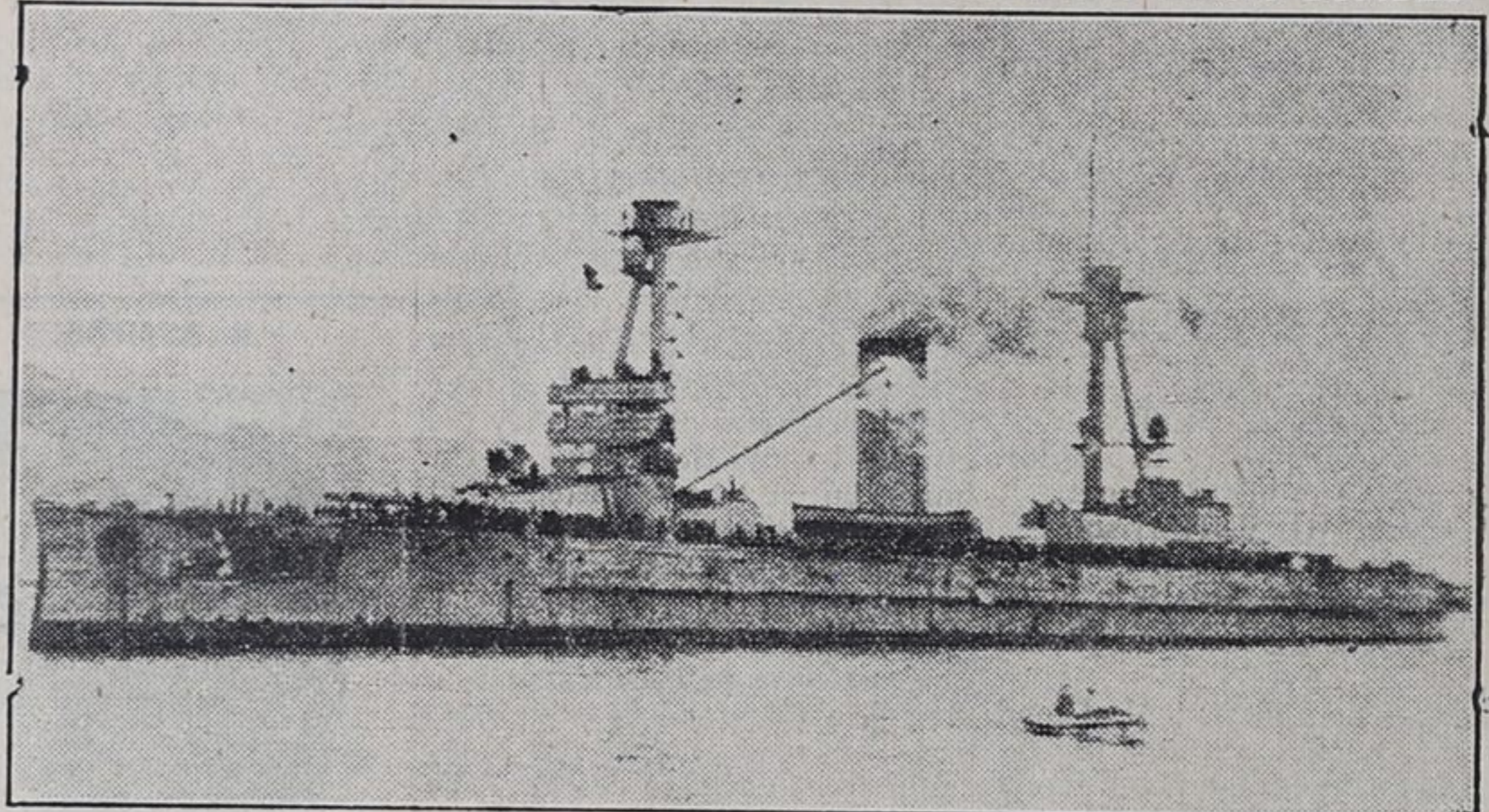

YOUNG KING OF JUGO-SLAVIA ON HOLIDAYS



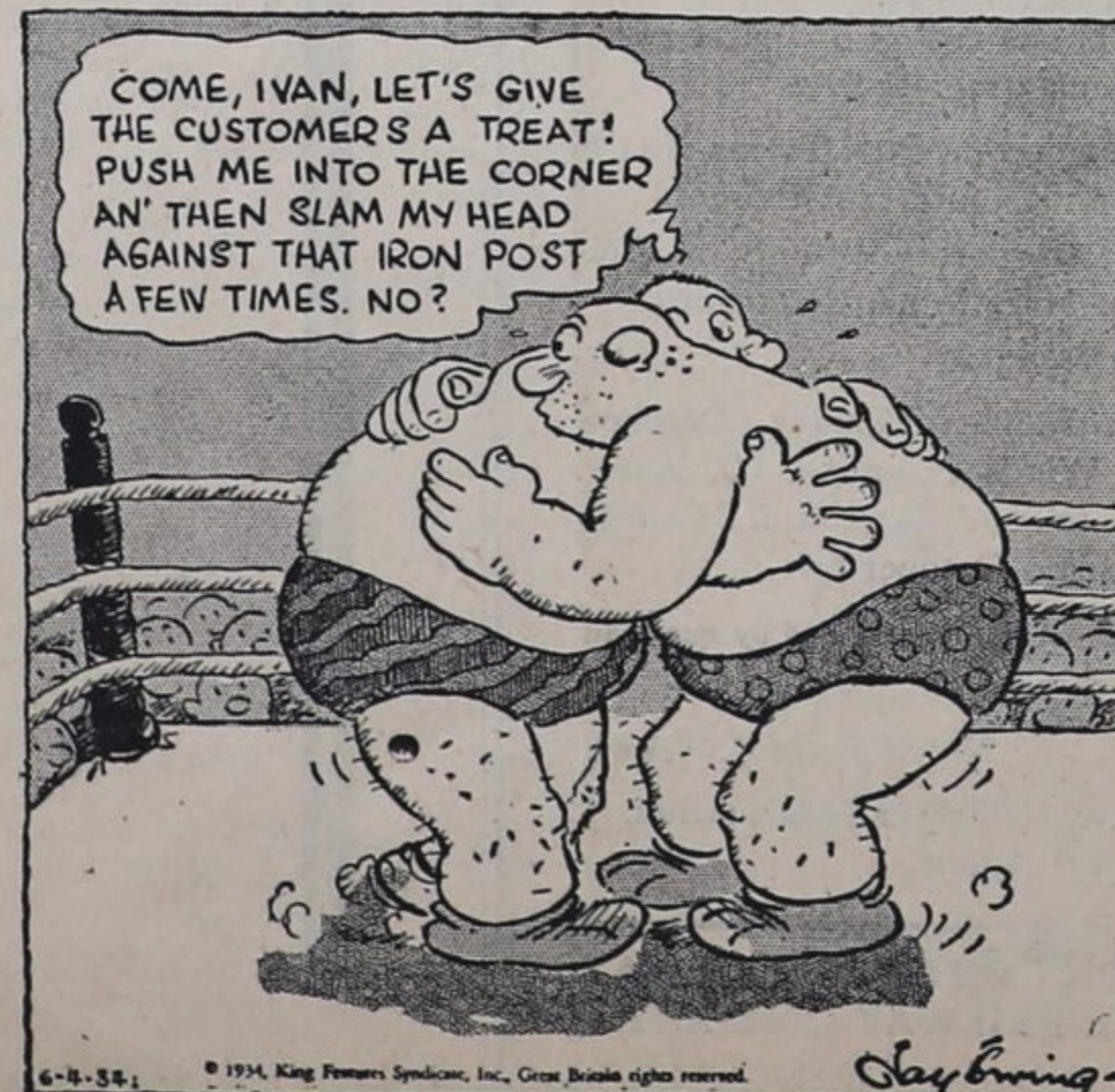
