THE DANGER PERIOD

Both motorists and pedestrians should exercise special care on the highways these days, or rather these nights. Statistics tell us that the hours between five and eight p.m., during the months of October, November and December form the most dangerous period in the whole year. It is during this period that the greatest number of fatal accidents occur on the highways, whatever the cause.

In this connection, there is one suggestion in regard to safety on the highways that is too often overlooked. That is that pedestrians should always walk on the left side of the road. There are too many people who, either through a mistaken idea of the traffic rules, or through carelessness, insist on "keeping to the right" when walking on the main roads.

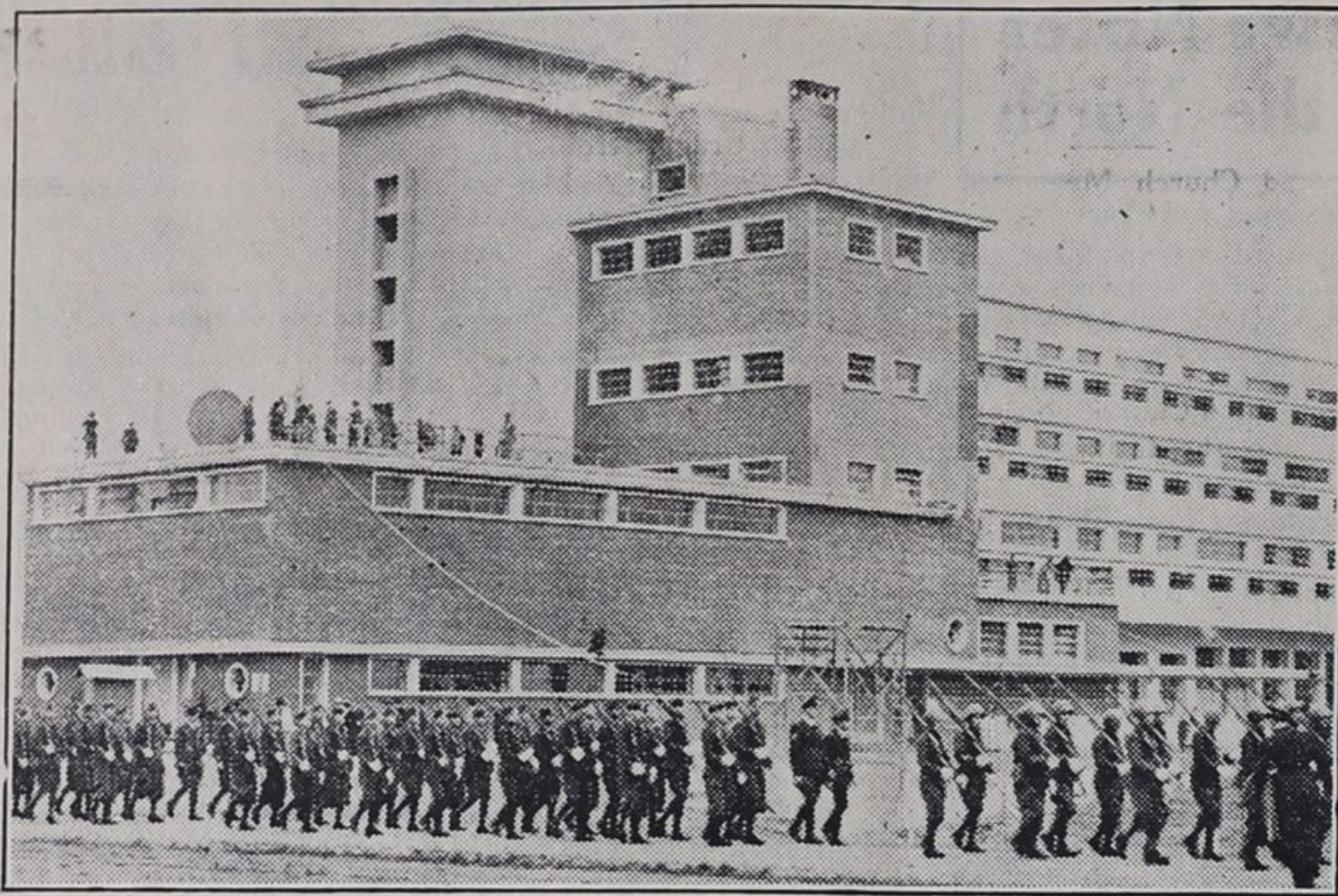

District Ore Shipments

Seven cars of ore were shipped by Cobalt mines from September 18th to October 9th, 1936, according to the statement issued this week by the T. & N.O. Railway. There were four shippers during the period and the total amount of ore was 587,002 pounds.

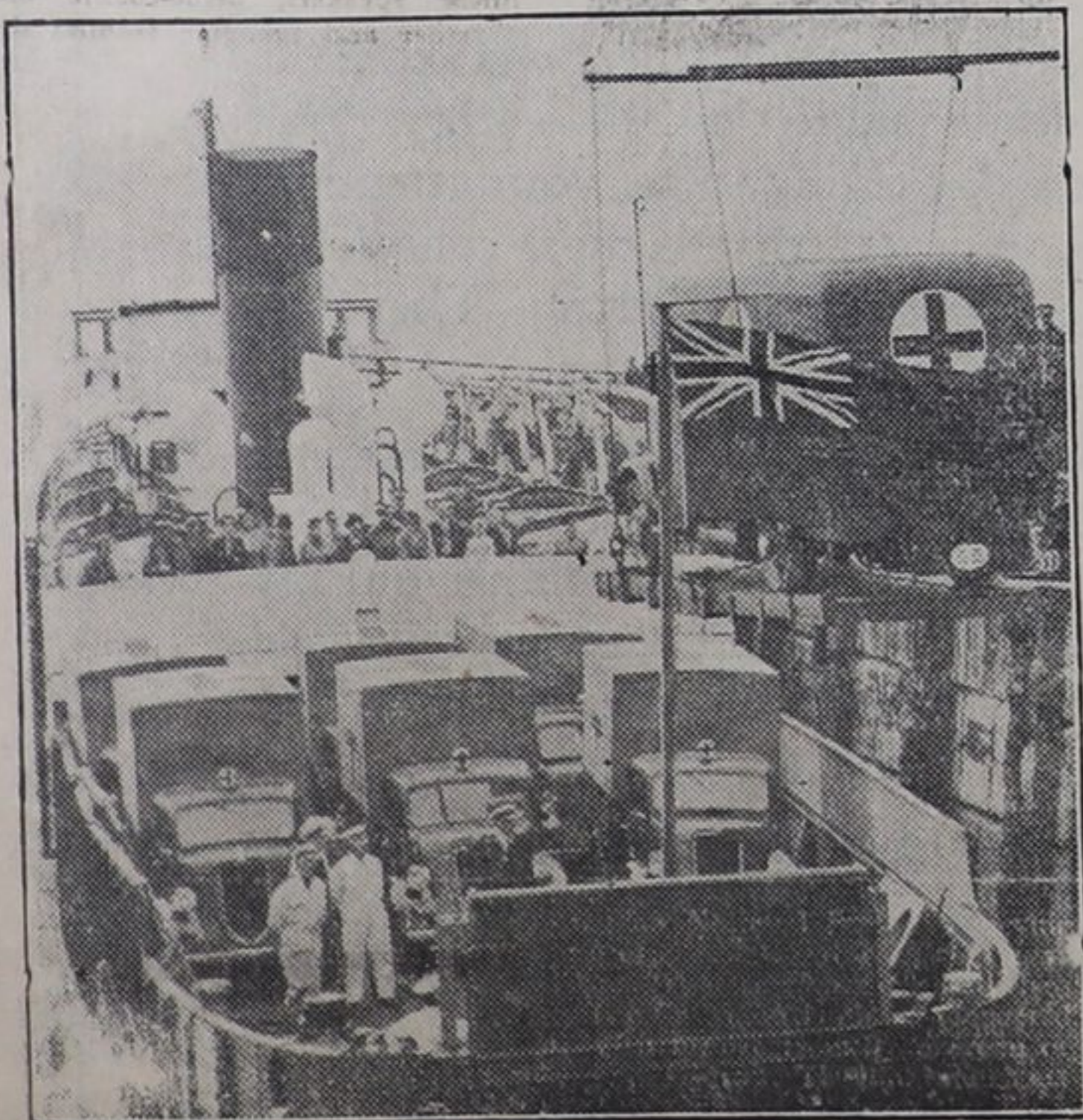
Classes for prospectors will be held in Haileybury this winter, according to a letter from the Ontario Department of Mines to the town council.

BUILDING NEW GARAGE AND SERVICE STATION TO HOUSE BUSES, CARS

Erection of a new garage and service station, at the corner of Rorke Avenue and Russell Street has been commenced by the McIsaac Transportation Company, operating the bus line between Cobalt, Haileybury and New Liskeard. The building of steel and tile construction, will be 34 by 54 feet, one storey, and will have storage room for four buses and a number of motor cars as well.

An office as headquarters of the company will be included in the main building and gasoline, oil supplies, etc., will be handled.

The site chosen for the new depot is on the main highway and at a central point on the 10-mile route over which the buses run. Since the commencement of the service early in 1935, the vehicles have been kept in public garages, but Mr. McIsaac, head of the company, says that the plan for a central headquarters will work out much more satisfactorily.

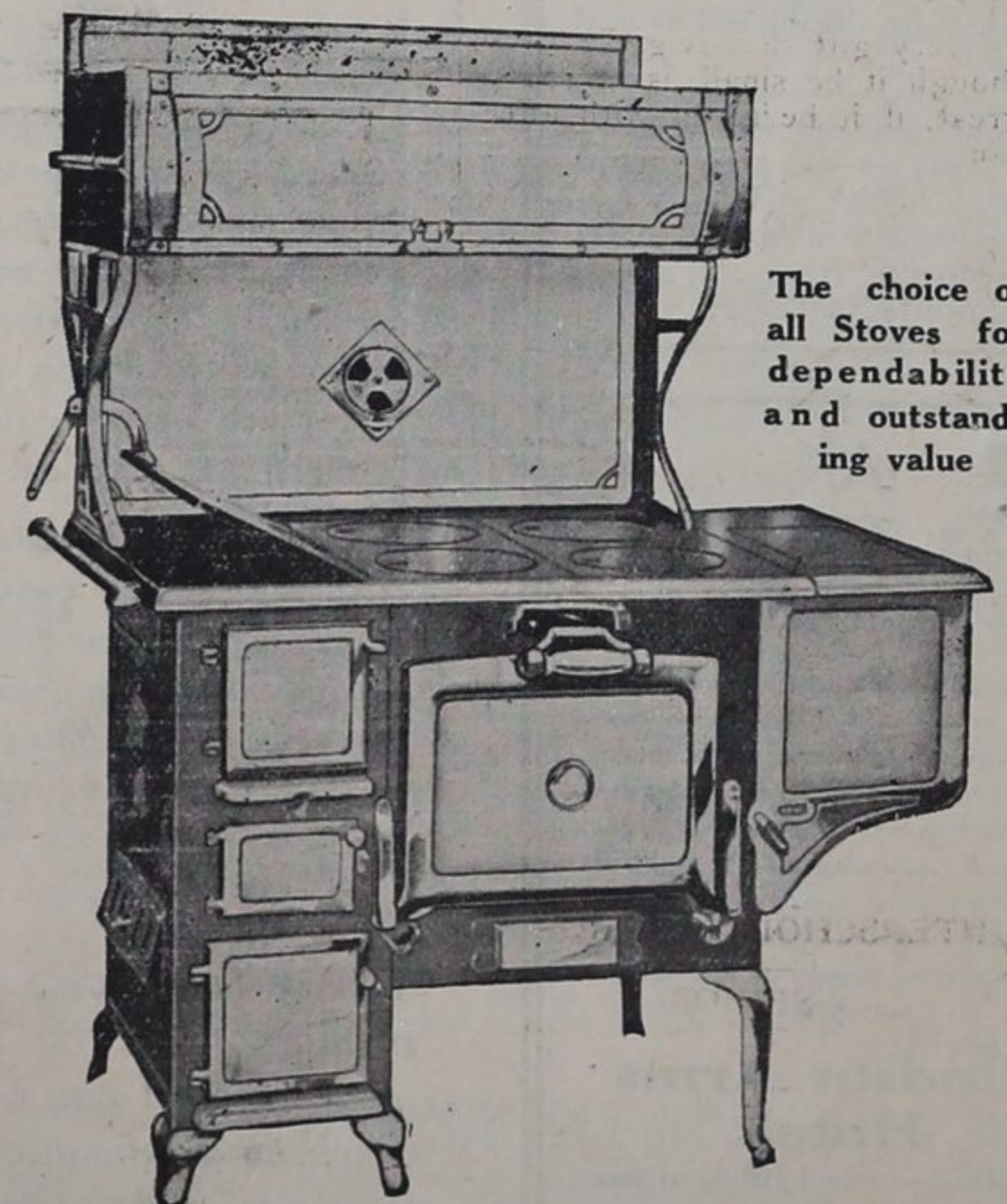
