### Killed by Falling Pipe

Impaled by a two-inch pipe which had the driving force of its 103-foot length and a fall of 147 feet behind it, at the Moffatt-Hall property, about six miles east of here around nine o'clock Friday night, Harry Omelchuk, 40-year-old Polish miner, died about 1.30 o'clock Saturday.

Because the death-dealing pipe line had been driven into the ground when its course through the man's body had spent itself and the other end had wedged in timbers, there was but one way to release the fully-conscious, suffering miner, by sawing through the pipe. — Northern News.

## GOLD OCCURRENCES EAST OF LAKE SUPERIOR IS SUBJECT OF REPORT

For the general information and guidance of prospectors, exploration companies, investors, and others that are associated with the gold industry, the Geological Survey, Department of Mines, Ottawa, has issued a report (Memoir No. 192) on the gold occurrences of Ontario east of Lake Superior. The report, by E. D. Kindle, has been prepared as far as possible in non-technical language, and deals with the geology and mining history of the thirty-two areas in which gold occurs. Descriptions are given of close to 700 gold deposits, and brief accounts are given of the mining development at the more active properties.

The report is essentially a compilation and summary of all the information available on gold occurrences in eastern Ontario to date of April 1, 1935. Most of the information has been derived from reports published by the Ontario Department of Mines, and by the Geological Survey. A

selection of references is given for each area.

The publication of the report is particularly timely in view of the widespread interest in the development of properties that had remained idle for years. It contains a wealth of useful and convenient information for exploration companies and groups of investors who may intend to utilize their funds in the re-examination of such properties.

Copies of the memoir may be obtained from the Director, Bureau of Economic Geology, Department of Mines, Ottawa.
