TOWN OF COBALT WILL BUY LATCHFORD LOTS AT ADVERTISED PRICE

Two parcels of land owned by Chief Justice Latchford in the town of Cobalt will be purchased by the municipality at the price advertised in The Haileyburian, if a decision of the council is approved by the town solicitor Jos. A. Legris, K.C. The lots have been the subject of a suit in Supreme Court for arrears of taxes and last spring the municipality got a judgment against the owner for an amount exceeding \$1,000. This decision of the court was appealed by the Chief Justice a month or two ago and the appeal has not been settled. In the meantime, Justice Latchford has advertised the property for sale at \$250 for each of the two parcels, and the municipality has decided to purchase them and allow the price to apply on the tax arrears. One parcel is assessed at \$1,500 and the other at \$1,300.

Governor-General To Make Appeal in Poppy Campaign

His Excellency Lord Tweedsmuir, Governor-General of Canada, will be heard over the radio tonight in an appeal in behalf of the Canadian Legion Poppy Campaign. There will be a coast-to-coast hook-up arranged by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation from 10 to 10.30, eastern standard time, with the broadcast originating at Ottawa. It is expected that Hon. Ernest Lapointe acting Prime Minister, and Hon. Ian Mackenzie, Minister of National Defence, will give short addresses, and readers are asked to remember that the date is this evening. The address will be from three to five minutes each in length, according to Legion announcement, and the balance of the time will be taken up with a suitable musical program.

The town of Cobalt will observe a two-hour interval of cessation of activity, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon, according to a resolution passed by the council on Monday night.

The Scoutmaster and the committee extend sincere thanks to the people who assisted so well on Saturday.
