The little three-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George A. Piche, Gaynoll Myrna, died yesterday afternoon at Misericordia Hospital, where she had been a patient for a short time only. Mr. and Mrs. Piche are former Haileybury residents, now living at Montreuil River, and they have the sympathy of a large circle of friends.

MRS. ALBERT CADMAN

An old and well known resident of Haileybury and the North Country, Mrs. Albert Cadman, passed away on Thursday last, December 3rd, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. L. Erenhaus, Lake Shore Road. She was 76 years of age and had been ill for a short time only.

Mrs. Cadman was born in Melrose, Scotland, on August 7th, 1860, and came to Canada in 1902, coming directly to this district to the farm on Dawson's Point, where she made her home for several years before moving to Haileybury. At that time the only means of travel to this section was via Mattawa and by boat up Lake Temiskaming.

During the great war years Mrs. Cadman was active in local women's organizations and worked without ceasing in providing comforts for the soldiers overseas, among whom were two of her sons. She was a faithful member of St. Paul's Church here and had many friends in the community.

Mrs. Cadman is survived by her husband, one daughter, Mrs. Erenhaus; two sons, William Ferguson, New Liskeard, and Alex., of Timmins, and three brothers, George Laidlaw, in Philadelphia; Thomas, in Edinburgh, and Walter, in Ayrshire, Scotland.

The funeral was held on Sunday afternoon, with the service in St. Paul's Church, conducted by Rev. R. Haines, and interment in Mount Pleasant Cemetery. The friends of Mrs. Cadman and the family filled the church to the doors and a long procession followed the funeral cortege to the cemetery. Pallbearers were Hon. W. A. Gordon, E. J. Holland, S. Atkinson, S. Norfolk, W. S. Blackwell and A. E. Stephenson, all old friends of the family.
