

Hobby Contest Of Rotary Club Now Under Way

Schedules Distributed to All Three Schools; Fourteen Classes Included

The Haileybury Rotary Club's hobby contest is now under way and this week schedules have been distributed to the public, separate and high schools, so that the pupils can all get busy.

There are 14 classes included in the schedule, so that every boy and girl can enter, and the rules and regulations are plainly set out. There are two respects in which the classifications may be made a little clearer and these have already brought some enquiries to members of the club. In the first place, it was decided that aeroplanes made from model kits purchased by the pupils would not be allowed, as it was felt that this was not a real test of workmanship.

The other question was in regard to pupils who attend the manual training classes at the public school. The club was asked to decide whether articles made in these classes would be eligible, and the answer is yes, providing the instructor certifies that the pupil has done the work entirely himself.

The club has supplied a goodly number of the schedules to each school, but it was difficult to estimate the correct number required. An additional quantity is available, so that if there is a shortage later on it can be remedied. Max Whitby, a member of the committee handling the contest, has these copies at his store where they can be secured if the need arises. The date of closing the contest has not yet been decided on, but all contestants are advised to start work just as soon as possible.

Report Earth Tremors at North Bay on Monday

Earth tremors that lasted about a half minute were reported from North Bay on Monday, believed to be an aftermath of the quake which shook a large section of the North Country on October 31st, 1935. There was no damage in the latest disturbance, which was also felt at Temiskaming Que., and other points in the neighborhood of the city.

Following an exhaustive study of conditions in the district and the fixing of the centre of the 1935 disturbance near Temiskaming, it was stated that there might be minor tremors expected over a considerable period.
