Extra Holiday For Christmas Is Now Assured

"Boxing Day" Will Be Observed in Haileybury, Cobalt and New Liskeard

As a result of a petition presented to the Haileybury town council on Tuesday evening, there will be an extra holiday for Christmas this year and the mayor will issue a proclamation fixing Saturday, December 26th, as a public holiday in the municipality.

In Cobalt and New Liskeard, similar plans have been made and in many other parts of the North Country the extra holiday will be kept.

Cobalt town council, meeting on Tuesday night, authorized Mayor Presse to proclaim the day a civic holiday, after a petition containing the signatures of sixteen grocers and butchers, four bakers and one barber had requested such action.

The day after Christmas is generally observed in England and during the past few years there has been a movement to make it a holiday in Canada.

Father Renaud Leaving Today For New Mission

Takes Charge of Four Townships in Northern Quebec; To Live at Canadian Malartic

Father J. A. Renaud, rector at Holy Cross Cathedral here for the past two years, is leaving today to take charge of a new mission in Northern Quebec. He will be in charge of the missionary work of the Roman Catholic Church in four townships, covering an area of about 20 miles square, with headquarters at the Canadian Malartic Mine.

Father Renaud came to Haileybury two years ago, but that was not his first service in the local parish. He was stationed here from 1914 to 1917, under the late Bishop Latulippe and met many of his former parishioners when he returned in 1934 to succeed Rev. J. M. Pelchat, now of Noranda.

On Sunday last, Father Renaud announced his impending departure, but up to the present there has been no announcement as to his successor in the rectorship of Holy Cross Cathedral.
