Uses Snowplane in Patrol of Communication Lines

Haileybury people had a look at an unusual vehicle yesterday, when T. J. Laprade of Ville Marie, drove his snowplane across the lake on a short visit here. The machine is driven by an aeroplane propeller and a Ford V8 engine, mounted at the rear, and runs on three skis. Mr. Laprade is a patrol man for the C.P.R. Communications, covering the route between Ville Marie and Rouyn, and uses the machine in his daily trips, making 25 to 30 miles per hour. It is capable of much higher speeds, however, and on the lake he drove between 50 and 60 miles. Three persons can sit comfortably in the vehicle the body of which is built somewhere between a motor car and an aeroplane.
