### Father and Son Badly Injured by Savage Dogs

Lorne Daigle of Island Falls is Victim; Well Known in This District

Friends and acquaintances of Lorne Daigle, formerly T. & N.O. agent at Lorrain Junction and relieving agent at both Cobalt and Haileybury, will learn with regret that he and his small son were badly injured in a mix-up with a dog team at Island Falls. The story is told in the following despatch from Cochrane to the North Bay Nugget:

"Rushed 43 miles on a railway speeder in zero weather from Island Falls to Cochrane after they had been severely mangled bya ferocious team of sleigh dogs Lorne Daigle, T. & N. O. station agent, and his four-year-old son, Bobby, were reported in favorable condition this morning.

Both are in Lady Minto Hospital, and were under anaesthetic Sunday as Dr. R. Lempey endeavored to replace lacerated muscle tissues. 
