New Find at Porcupine

Believed to be the most important discovery in the Porcupine camp for many years, a wide vein was discovered on the Electore property, about ten miles east of Pamour, this week. The vein is 65 feet wide in one section, with other sections measuring 20 feet, 20 feet and 10 feet, giving 115 feet of ore altogether. Values range to \$7.50.—Timmins Press.

Winter Road to Mines

The splendid efforts of the local committee which has been working on the matter for some time, and the ready co-operation of the Quebec government through the earnest efforts of N. E. Lariviere, M.L.A., have borne fruit and by Jan. 1st, a winter road from Rouyn-Noranda right through to Val d'Or will be ready for motor cars and truck traffic, and the mines along the route will be brought practically one hundred miles closer to the twin cities than they are at present.—Rouyn-Noranda Press.

Relief Costs Down

Relief costs for the 11½ months ended November 15 were \$35,006.04 down on the same period in 1935, the cost of which was \$96,754.11, according to figures presented to Township Council by William Birnie, relief officer. On November 15 of this year there were 68 heads of families and 245 dependents on relief compared with 210 heads and 705 dependents on the same date in 1935.—Kirkland Lake Northern News.
