

### Cobalt Juniors Protest Win of Liskeard Sextet

**Claim Farmers Used Ineligible Player; Liskeard Outscore Miners by 5 to 3**

Cobalt and New Liskeard Juniors tangled in the silver town on Tuesday night in a fast, clean game. These two teams display plenty of opposition for the strong local kids.

Cobalt played the game under protest, claiming Sutcliffe, who played for the Farmers for the past few seasons but who is now attending college, ineligible under the N.O.H.A. residence rule. The protest will be heard in a short time, and decision given.

The game started slowly, each team feeling out its opponents. McPhee passed to Thompson, who put the "Liskies" in the lead. Croteau soon evened it up, however, on a pass from Holouka.

The second period was wide-open hockey with both outfits going full blast. Referee Bill Bagshaw called back a Liskeard goal when one of the boys kicked the puck into the net. On a nice bit of teamwork, with T. Croteau and J. Gabbani, Kelly was able to put the home town squad one up; only to have Pelkie tie it up again after a lone rush.

The last frame went to Liskeard; McPhee scored unassisted, Holmes netted one from Thompson's pass, then Sutcliffe finished the victors' scoring. Cobalt's line of Chartier, Mercier and D. Gabbani combined for the last goal of the game, while McPhee was serving a penalty.

### Cobalt Puckists Win Opener, 6-2 from Haileybury

**Fast-Breaking Line Makes Local Lads Look Lazy; Sixteen Penalties Served**

Cobalt Seniors invaded Haileybury Monday night and persuaded the locals to start off the season on the wrong end of a 6-2 score. The home town boys gave all they had, but the teampay of the lads from the silver town won the game.

Despite the defeat of the locals the small group of fans in attendance got their money's worth in stiff bodychecks and from the sixteen penalties handed out by Referee Jack Wilder. More vocal support would help the boys along greatly.

The players opened up from the start, but there was no scoring until late in the period, then while Hughes was serving his second penalty for roughing it with Douglas, Hylands slipped a pass to Odette who made no mistake about planting it behind St. Louis.

Cobalt made sure of their lead early in the second with two more goals, one by McDonald from Rorke and one by Croteau unassisted. When both teams were a man short Renaud tallied Haileybury's first after an end to end rush, making the score 3-1. Toward the end of the period Cobalt picked up another pair, when Hylands snared a loose puck and rapped it home, while Odette and Gabbani teamed up to get another and Grozelle finished the scoring for the period to make it 5-2.

In the last frame, both teams played much better hockey. Frequent ganging attacks on both goals failed till Thibeault, on a pass from Douglas, finished the scoring.
