"Alarm Gas" Effective

Burning out rails was the cause of a fire in a chute on the 675-foot level at the Hollinger on Tuesday evening, it was announced officially by the Hollinger this morning. Immediately the alarm was turned in, the acrid fumes of harmless "alarm gas" poured into the ventilating system, warned every man underground that there was a fire in the mine. The system worked perfectly and within a short time of the discovery of the fire, every man not in the fire fighting squad was on surface.—Porcupine Advance.

Better Mail Service

Following up complaints that mail addressed to Larder Lake from Kirkland travelled to North Bay and back reaching the now busy mining camp and summer resort, the executive of the board of trade took the matter up with the postal authorities. As a result, C. L. Grisdale, president of the board states that he has received a letter from the district superintendent at North Bay informing him that there is now a daily exchange of locked bags between the two points, except on Sunday.—Northern News.

Demand for Woodsmen

An unprecedented demand for lumber workers is reported by officials of the Ontario employment service branch in Timmins today. A recent order filled with the heads of the office here is giving employment to many workmen who previously were listed on the town's unemployed rolls. The order was given out by the pulp and paper company at Kapuskasing and already many Timmins men are preparing to leave town to take over new duties in the woods near the paper town.—Timmins Press.

Saved Baby From Burning Crib

To snatch her baby from a crib which was beginning to smoke from the intense heat generated as the house burned, was the experience on Monday night of Mrs. J. B. Vincent, wife of a Cheminis storekeeper, whose house and store went up in smoke that night. Mr. Vincent had gone from Cheminis into one of the nearby prospects with a team he had just bought in the hope of getting some work to help in the slack winter season. In the Monday blaze the mother was able to get all the children out of the house, some of them in their bare feet, into the night which was twenty below.—Northern News.
