A study of the rules in the printed schedules should give the required information, but if any point is not clear, a member of the Club should be consulted. A Rotarian from the west who was a recent visitor here was greatly interested in the Hobby Fair and, being a stamp collector he is offering a prize of \$3 for the best collection shown. This will be in addition to the regular prizes. All the Rotary Club asks is for the boys and girls to do their part to make the fair a success. The prizes are well worth striving for.
