Paragraphs Pertaining to Happenings of Interest During the Past Week

Plan Town Gateway

The New Liskeard Horticultural Society at its annual meeting last week, discussed a proposal for the erection of "some suitable entrance or gateway to the town with a planting scheme to add to its attractiveness." Nothing very definite was arrived at, but a committee was formed to go further into the question. Chas. A. Byam, past president of the Ontario Horticultural Association, was re-elected president, with Mrs. P. R. Craven and J. M. Beams as first and second vice-presidents respectively.

Appointed Town Solicitor

"This appointment will save the town trouble and money," said Mayor J.P. Bartleman, commenting upon the appointment of S. A. Caldwell, Crown Attorney, as town solicitor at a salary of \$150 per month.

The resolution appointing Mr. Caldwell to the post was passed unanimously at yesterday's meeting of the town council. Under the resolution Mr. Caldwell will perform all legal services for the town, including the drawing up of by-laws, handling the damage actions for the town and any other legal work which is authorized by the municipality.—Timmins Press.

Picketing at Timmins

Information has been issued by Timmins police against Sam Bucovetsky Limited and Marshall Eclestone alleging that these stores remained open yesterday contrary to by-laws that came into effect here yesterday.

Yesterday afternoon six pickets paraded up and down the Third Avenue fronts of both stores against which police have laid information. The men and women bore placards asking "Citizens! Help to enforce the Wednesday afternoon closing bylaw" as well as other placards into which the names of the two firms were drawn.—Porcupine Advance.

New Rouyn Theatre

David Korman of Englehart was in the twin cities over the week-end, and while here made the announcement that he plans to resume work April 1st on the building of a modern new theatre on his property just south of the Windsor Hotel block on Main Street, Rouyn.

Work was started a couple of times previously on excavation for this project, but was discontinued, Mr. Korman says, because of the necessity of securing additional land at the rear of his Main Street lot.—Rouyn-Noranda Press.

Tuberculosis Lecture

Suggesting that one very worthy objective for a local service club would be the sale of the Christmas seals which are issued by the Anti-Tuberculosis League, Dr. D. G. Wilson, medical superintendent of the sanatorium at Haileybury gave the Lions Club a graphic and startling picture of the ravages which tuberculosis is working in the North Country and other parts of Ontario.

With ruthless detail the doctor not only gave facts and figures, but with X-ray films of actual cases showed the physical ruin which the disease brings about, the grim story being softened by his accounts of the cures which can be effected by the rest cure or surgery.—Kirkland Lake Northern News.
