CANADA, 1937

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics announces the publication of the 1937 edition of the Official Handbook of Canada.

The Handbook covers the present situation in the Dominion from Atlantic to Pacific, the weight of emphasis being placed on those aspects which are currently of most importance. All phases of the country's economic organization are dealt with, and statistics are brought up to the latest possible moment. The text is accompanied by a wealth of pertinent illustrative matter, which adds to the interest of the subjects treated.

The text and page illustrations are printed in tone and there are two photogravure inserts, one of which, the frontispiece, is a reproduction of an official photograph of King George VI, together with the texts of the Proclamation of his accession to the Throne and the Prime Minister's Message on behalf of the people of Canada; the other insert is illustrative of Canada's export trade, a branch of our economy which has shown such splendid progress during the past year.

The price of the publication is 25 cents per copy, which charge covers merely the cost of paper and actual press work. A special price concession has been authorized in the case of teachers, bona fide students, and ministers of the religion, since past experience has shown that considerable use has been made of this publication for educational purposes, and it is the policy of the Minister to encourage such use. To such individuals therefore, the price is set at 10 cents for one copy. Postage stamps are not acceptable, and applications must be accompanied by a postal note or by the appropriate coin enclosed between two squares of thin cardboard gummed together at the edges. Applications should be addressed to the King's Printer, Government Printing Bureau, Ottawa, Canada and since the supply is strictly limited for both the 25-cent and 10-cent classes, early application is suggested.

COMPROMISE SETTLEMENT

A compromise settlement, reached at the week-end after the contending parties had submitted their respective suggestions and the municipal council had sat until after one o'clock Friday morning wrestling with the problem, has been reached in the dispute between the township of Coleman and three mining companies, and which developed as a sequel to a cave-in of workings on the McKinley-Darragh property, just south of the town of Cobalt, in June, 1935. The mishap carried a part of a township road into the mine and legal proceedings had followed, although the case never reached trial.

Under the terms of the agreement, it is stated, the township will receive payment for disbursements made, including law costs and traveling expenses, while the companies will contribute 75 per cent toward the cost of improving the substituted road, which follows for a short distance the right of way of the Nipissing Central Railway's old Kerr Lake line. Previously, council had held out for payment of all costs, including those necessary to fix the road, while the companies were willing to settle for one thousand dollars cash.

The workings, while on McKinley-Darragh ground, were being operated by Cobalt Properties, who had taken over from Mining Corporation of Canada. Since assuming office this year, Reeve William Martin had made a trip to Toronto with Arthur Brocklebank, of Cobalt Properties, to discuss matters with representatives of Mining Corporation and McKinley Securities, the other parties involved, and council resumed negotiations late last week.

ACTION DISMISSED WITH COSTS

The Northern Ontario Power Co. has lost out in its court case with LaRoche Mines, Ltd., in the "life of the mine contract" action argued before Mr. Justice Greene at Temiskaming Assizes in Haileybury last October. Judgment has just been given by his Lordship, dismissing the action, with costs, the announcement under Osgoode Hall news reading:

"Northern Ontario Power Co. Ltd., vs LaRoche Mines Limited—trial at Haileybury. Action brought by the plaintiff for damages said to have been suffered by the breach of a contract for the transmission and supply of electrical energy for use of the defendant's mining properties located in the Porcupine district. R. S. Robertson, K.C. and J. A. Legris, K.C., for plaintiff; R. F. Wilson for defendant.

"Judgment: "... there is nothing in the evidence nor the surrounding circumstances to justify a finding of bad faith on the part of the mining company... there was no implied term in the agreement that the defendant should not dispose of its properties... the mining company's funds were exhausted and its action in selling to another company had redounded to the benefit of the plaintiff... The action is dismissed with costs."

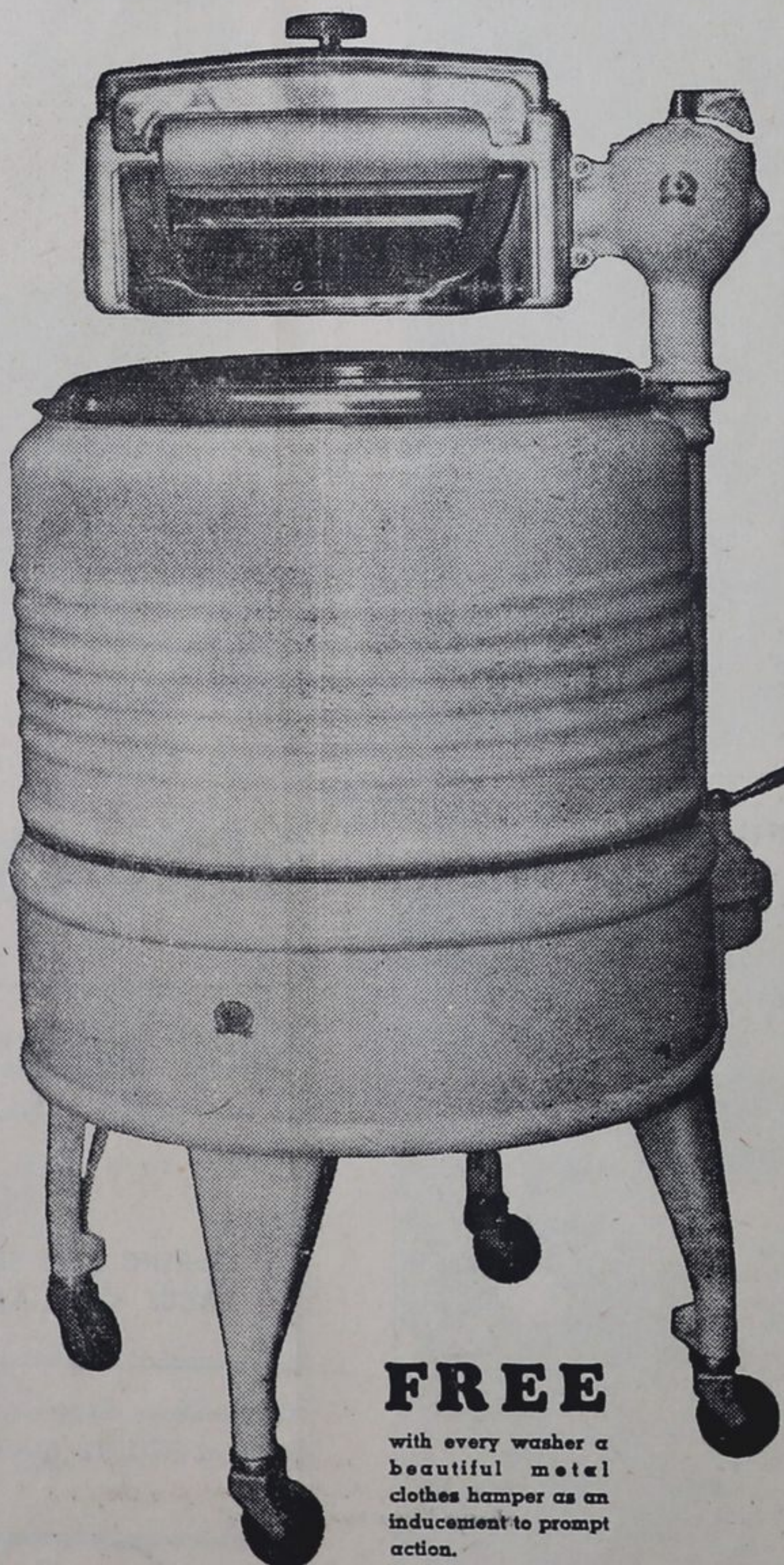
