An official announcement in Montreal is to the effect that the Haileybury Hospital will be rebuilt this year by the Sisters of Providence, who owned and operated the one destroyed by the fire in 1922.

Ed. Talbot of Ville Marie, is

operating a stage line between there and Haileybury with a broad-runnerd sleigh, driven by an aeroplane engine.

The town council has decided not to sell the old Shanahan property at the south end of the town, although two offers have been made for it recently.

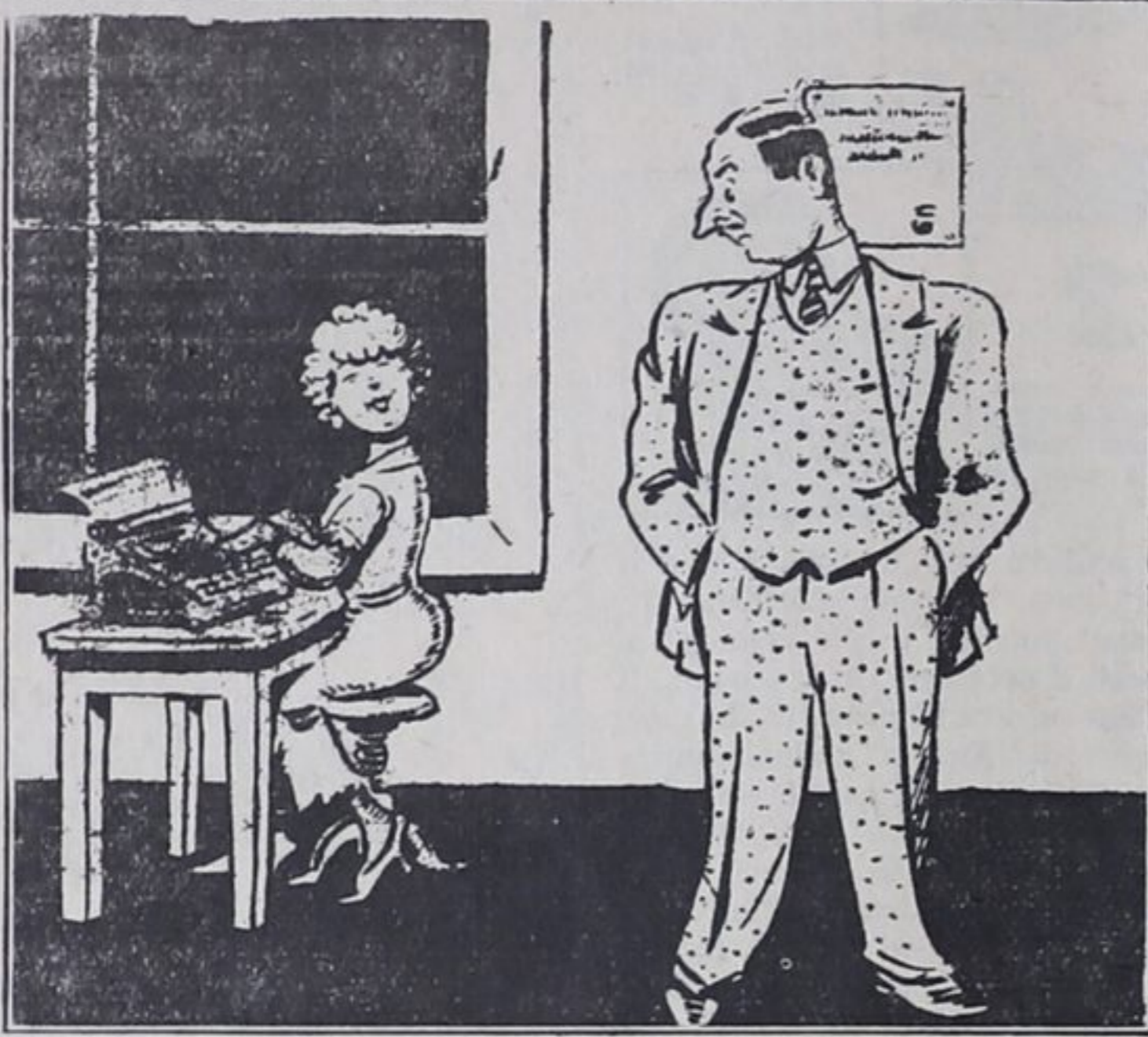
Emmett Smith's rink won the Grand Aggregate, the President's Cup, and the McKellar Cup at the annual N.O.C.A. Bonspiel, which
