



NEW BRITISH PLANE TO COMPETE FOR TRANS-ATLANTIC HONORS



Our photograph shows a full-size model of the new "Clyde Clipper" air liner which is being built at Willesden as a British entry in the New York to Paris air race, for which the French Government has put up \$150,000 in prize money The race is to be flown in August to commemorate the tenth anniversary of Colonel Lindbergh's solo flight across the Atlantic Ocean. Normally a 14-passenger plane, the machine will be equipped with two pilots, radio operator, and an engineer. The new plane will be powered with the famous Rolls-Royce "Kestrel" engines, and will have a cruising speed of 216 miles an hour.
