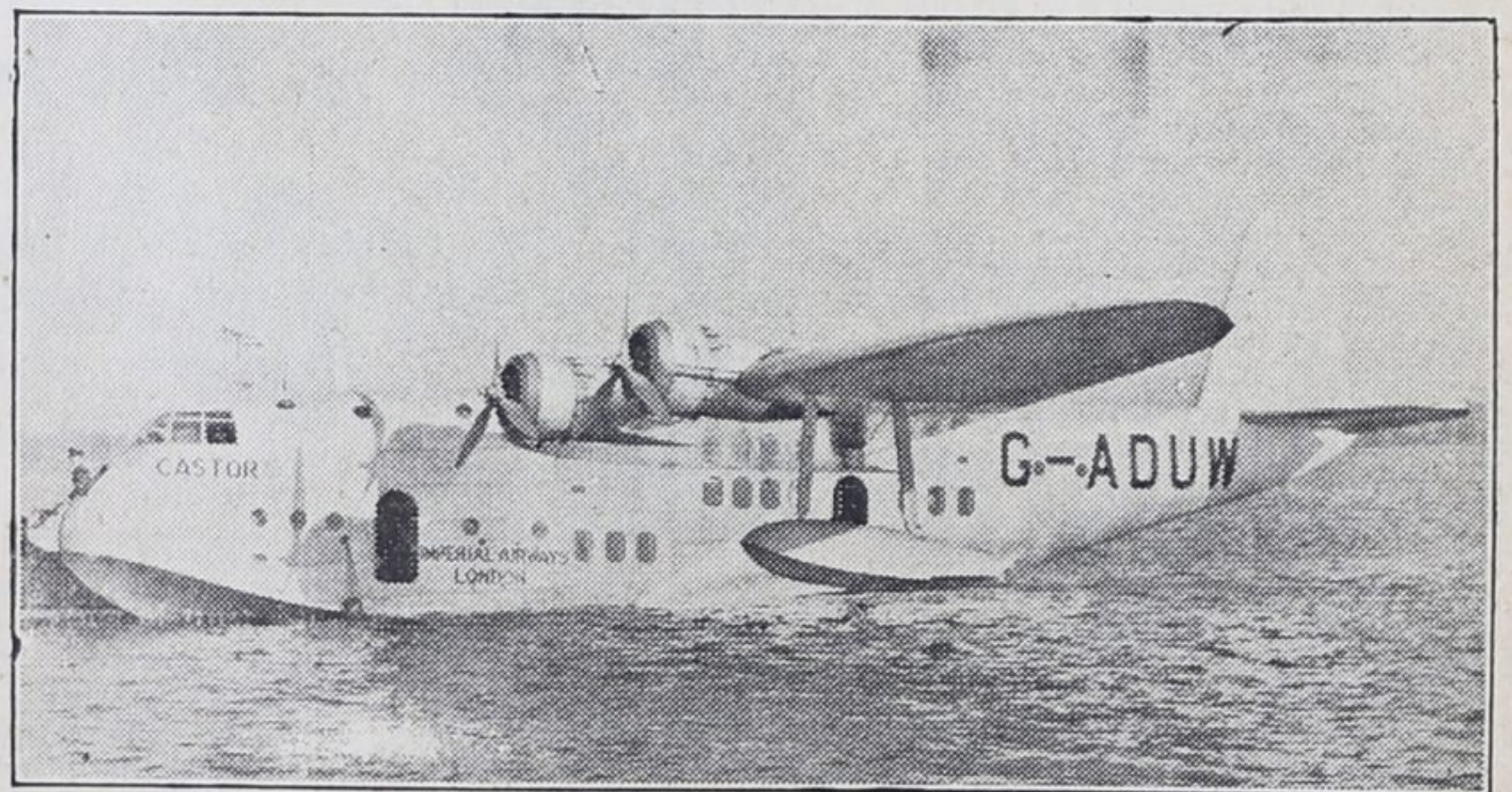

SCOTLAND DEFEATS WALES IN RUGBY INTERNATIONAL



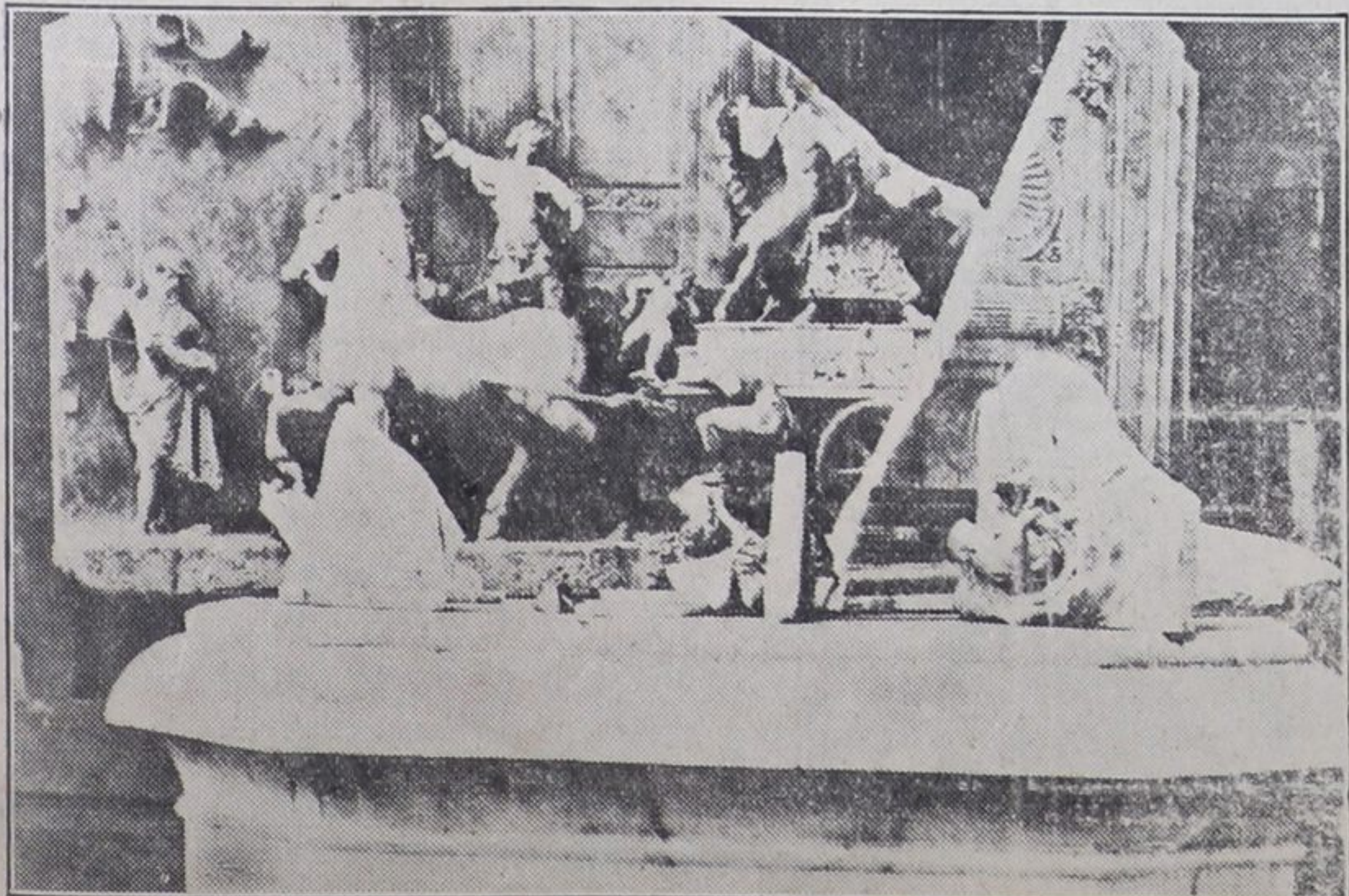

ANOTHER EMPIRE FLYING BOAT READY FOR SERVICE



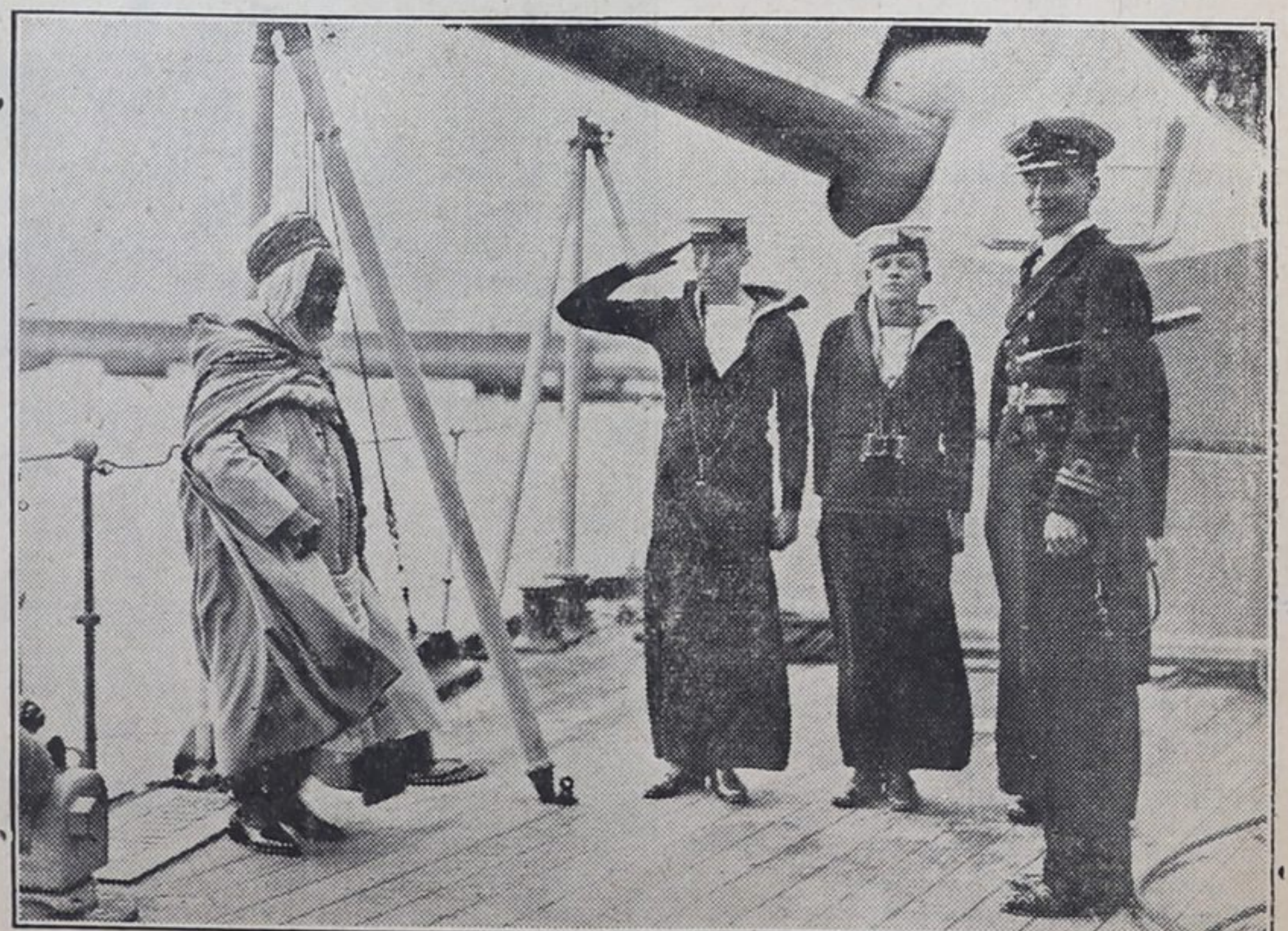
