

The Canadian Curling championships, held in Toronto, was one of the keenest ever held in the Dominion. The Macdonald Brier Tankard, emblematic of the single rink curling championship was particularly interesting, with Manitoba and Alberta finishing the series in a first-place tie. Alberta won the play-off rather easily, the Winnipeggers being away below the form flashed in earlier contests.
