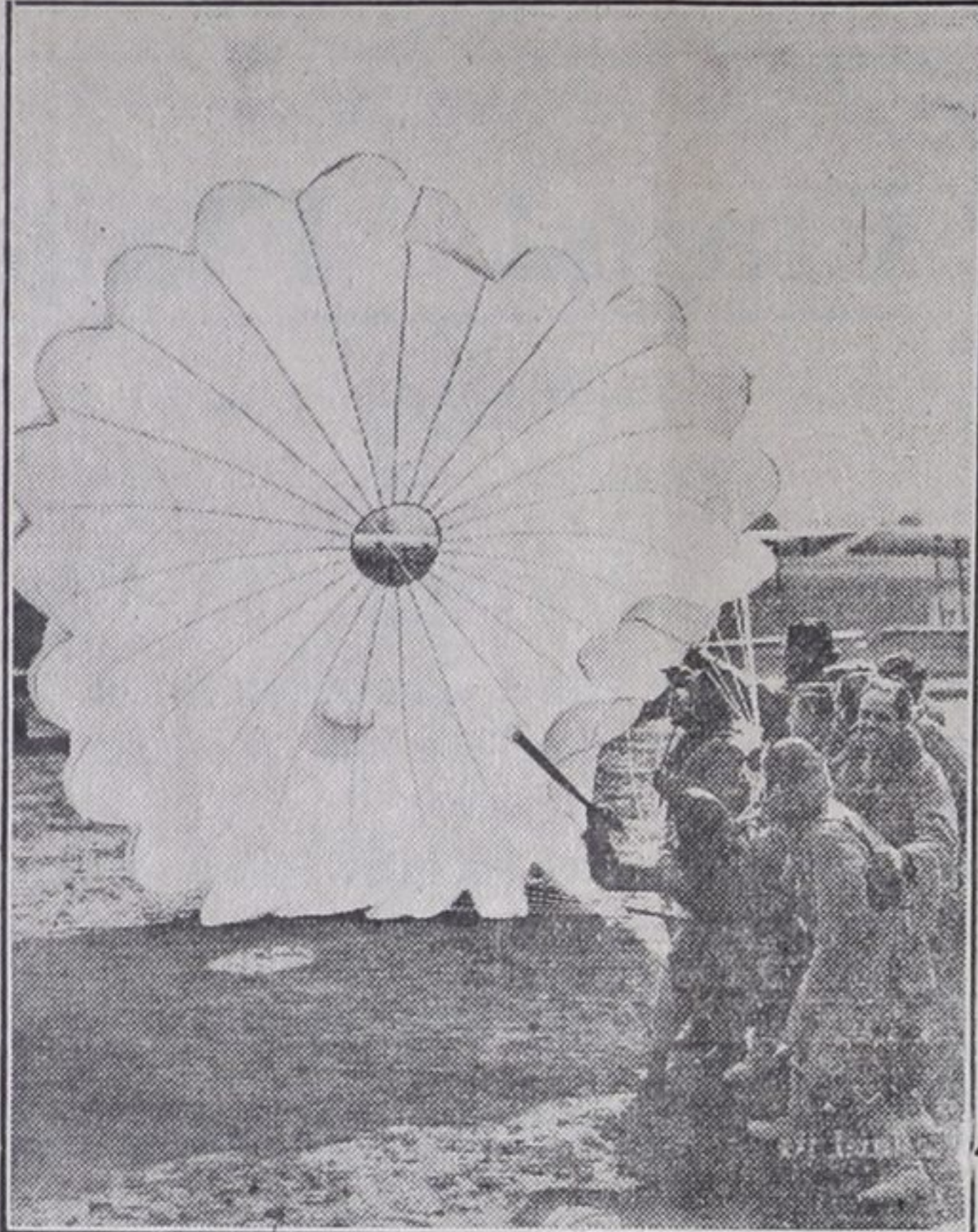


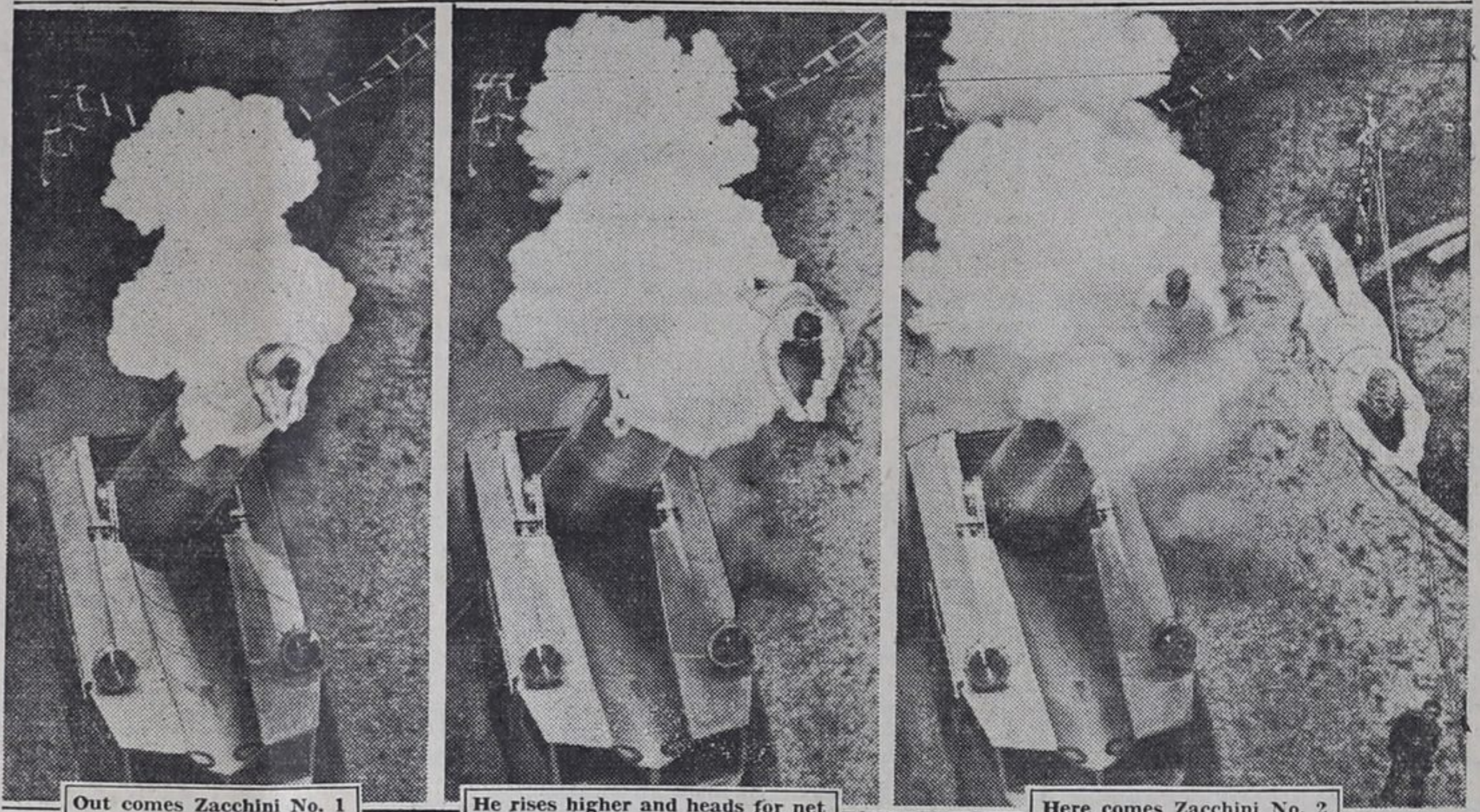

The magic eye camera climbs to the top of the circus tent in New York to photograph one of the most remarkable of all big stunts, the blasting of the Zacchini brothers from a cannon. Begin at the left and you can see Zacchini No. 1 just coming out of the cannon's mouth in a haze of smoke, and end at the right and you'll see both human bullets on the way to the net. The brothers are Hugo and Mario, and they perform for Rinfiling Brothers, Barnum and Bailey Circus, which imported their act from Germany.

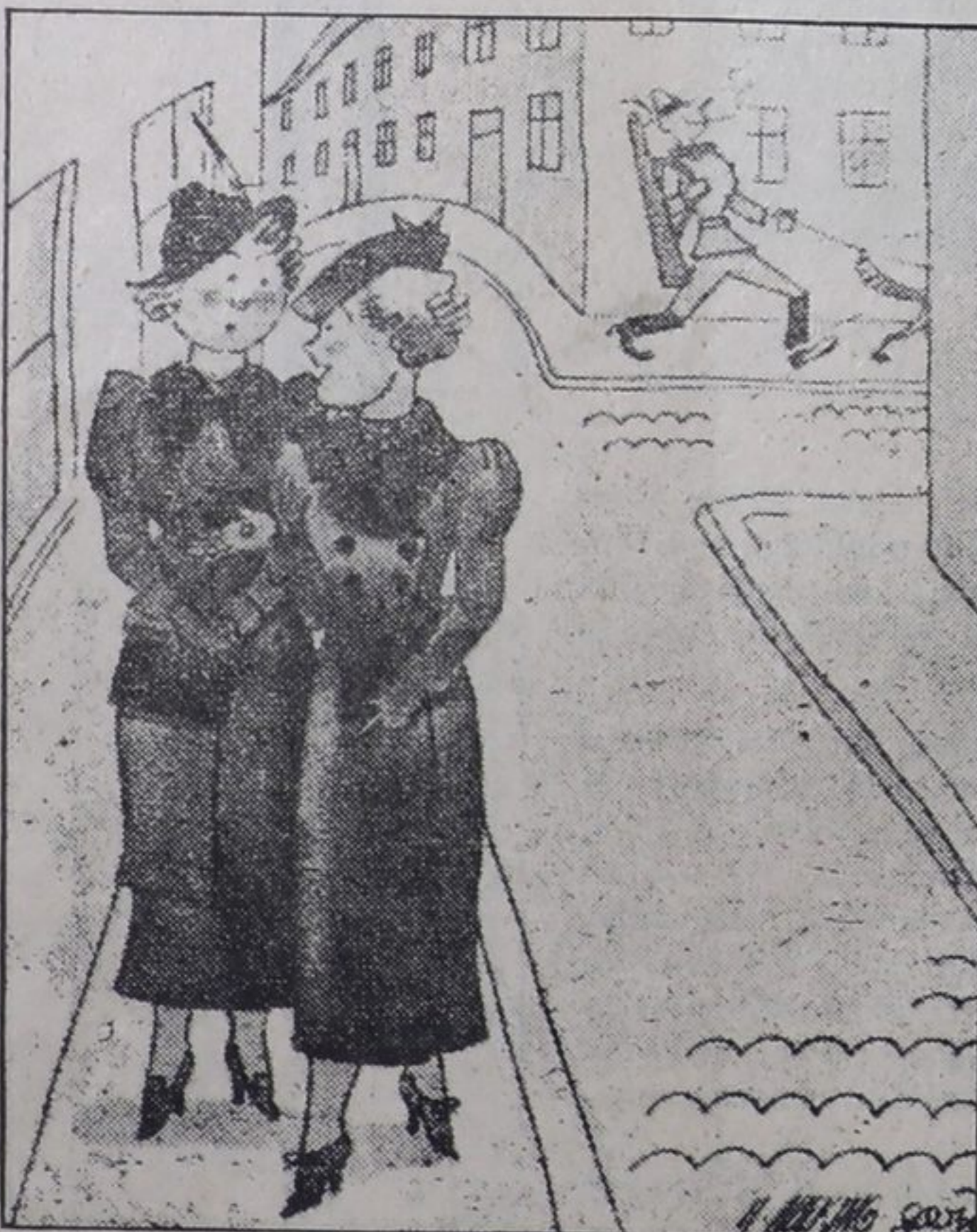


Two women strikers get ride
