

Club Is Formed To Adopt Ship Named For Silver Town

Former Cobalt Residents Will Raise Fund to Provide Sailors' Comforts

For the purpose of "adopting" the Canadian corvette which bears the name of the silver town and which to some extent through force of circumstances is stated to have been an "orphan" ship the H.M.S. Cobalt Club is being organized, its members to be men formerly connected with the camp, assisted in measure by present residents of the community there as response is made. Already, in initial efforts, arrangements have been made for supplying magazines regularly, approximately a half-month's supply of cigarettes has gone forward and three radios have been provided for the use of the crew.

Members of the club as a starter, include Richard Pearce, one of the editors of The Northern Miner, H. C. McCloskey, formerly of the McKinley-Darragh mine, Fraser D. Reid of the Coniagas property, and Gilbert LaBine, all men who were associated with mining in Cobalt's earlier days. Administrator of the fund which is to be provided is R. S. Taylor of New Liskeard, and for years a citizen of Cobalt, and who had been asked to take over those

duties. Other mining men are to be approached, it has been indicated from Toronto, and the Kiwanis club in Cobalt itself is expected to play its part in the project.

Donations of \$50 each from the Toronto men mentioned were the first financial contributions to the fund, and other money will be raised. It was stated that some 10,000 cigarettes had been forwarded to the ship, which carries a crew of 69 officers and men, while subscriptions have been placed with six well-known magazines of a wide variety of interests, and for two copies apiece of these to be sent regularly through the naval authorities. It is probable, also, that fruit for the crew will be available when the ship is in port, through the fund, although the commanding officer had indicated that it was scarcely feasible to have this particular comfort at other times, since the corvette is at sea for considerable periods.

The idea apparently originated with Mr. Pearce, who approached other former Cobalters, and who was in touch with government officials in connection with the plan under consideration. It has been calculated that each man requires from 250 to 300 cigarettes as a monthly allowance, according to an estimate made. Mr. Taylor said at the week-end that he expected to be in touch with the Cobalt Kiwanians, who already had been sounded out in the matter, during the present week, when the connection of the members of the club with this particu-

lar form of war work would be given consideration.

When the corvette "Cobalt" was sent on its career, the municipality presented the vessel with a desk set of appropriate construction and design, and this is carried wherever the ship goes. The matter of comforts for the crew is said also to have been partly attended to from the camp, but residents there have been concentrating largely on work for the men from their own section who have joined up in the services, none of whom, so far as is known, is on the "Cobalt." It is believed likely that Kiwanians

will make some arrangements for receiving any donations that people of the district may feel like making to the new fund, in amounts large or small, and meantime old Cobalters in Toronto and elsewhere are being canvassed in this connection.

REGIONAL OFFICE OF WARTIME PRICE BOARD OPEN AT NORTH BAY

The regional office of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board for this district has been opened at 69 First Street, North Bay, according to an announcement

made last week. A. T. Smith, a North Bay businessman, has been appointed representative, and all enquiries, correspondence, claims and requests for information regarding the new "ceiling" law on prices from the district will be handled by him. The office supervises that part of Ontario north of a line west from Mattawa to Huntsville to Parry Sound and Georgian Bay, including the Manitoulin Island and extending from the Quebec border to a line running between Hearst and Michipicoten on Lake Superior. There are 13 regional offices covering the Dominion.

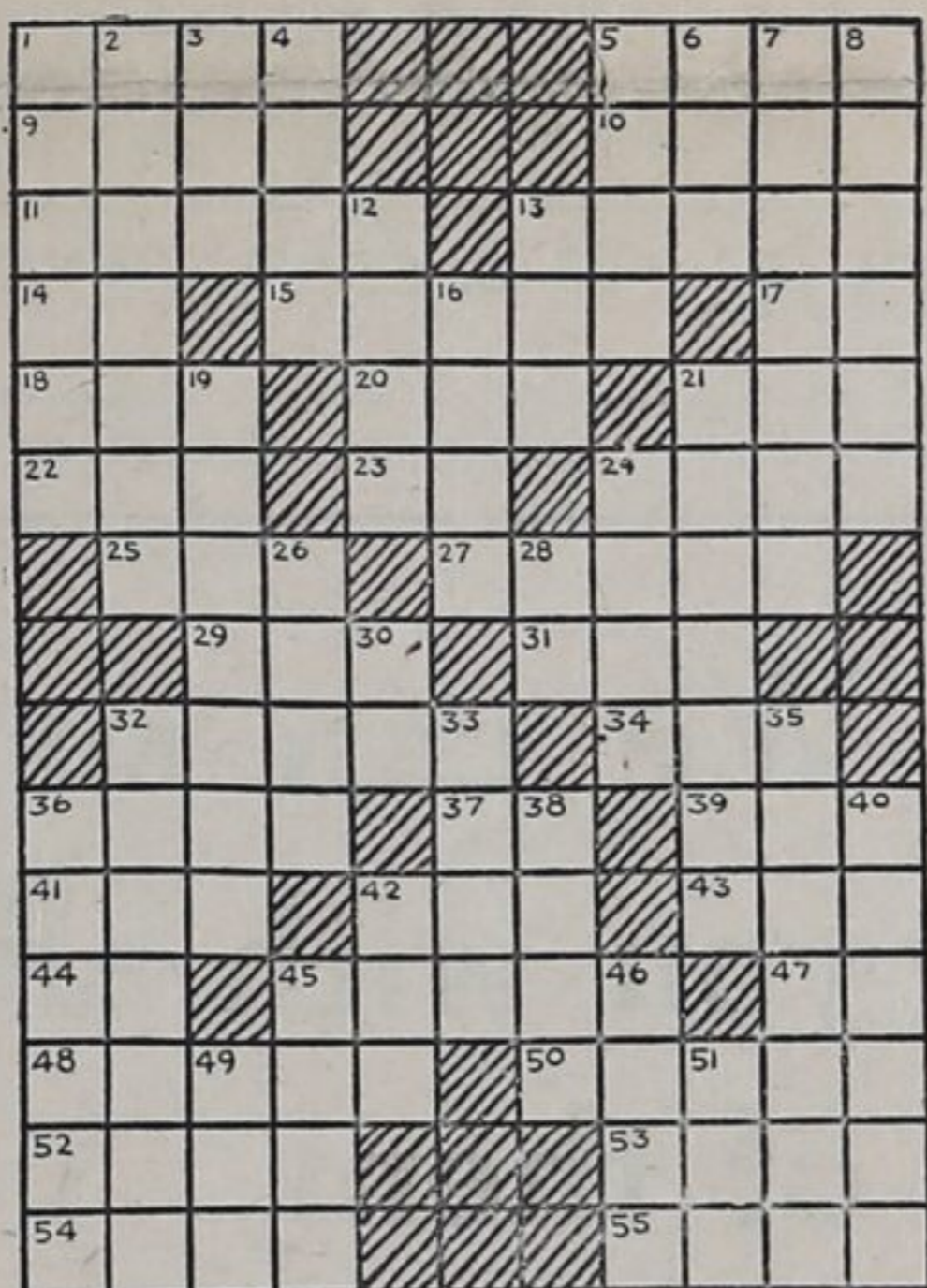
